GOOD HERRING FISHERY.

Among the Prospero's freight were seven hundred barrels of herring which came from Green Bay where, we learn, from passengers, who came on the ship, the fishes are very plentiful and of a large size. The outlook for a prosperous voyage is bright, though a material drawback to the fishermen engaged is the shortage of barrels in which to pack the herring. The packers are putting up their catches mostly under the "Scotch" cure so as to get the most profitable re sults.




