GUARDING MR. HOHENZOLLERN.

AMERONGEN, March 22. There was a state of extreme alert around the Von Benintinck Castle, throughout the night and this morning, in consequence of the former German Emperor having received last evening two violently threatening letters, one emanating from Amsterdam and the other from the Belgian frontier, and also a telegram from a friend warning him of the menacing peril. All the Dutch Gendarmes watching over the ex-emperor's welfare were kept on duty, instead of half their number being allowed their accustomed rest. This morning all the garden paths in the neighborhood, where Mr. Hohenzollern was engaged in sawing wood, were constantly patrolled by armed guards, while even outside the walls of the castle, gendarmes were carrying loaded carbines.

A FITTING SOUVENIR.

LONDON, Mar. 22. Admiral W. H. Sims, U. S. Navy, was the guest of the Pilgrims Club at a dinner last night, and as a souvenir of the occasion, was presented with a large block of oak from Nelson's Flagship "Victory," with an inscription on a silver plate. Admiral Sims, in a brief address, spoke of the close co-operation which has obtained between the two navies, and remarked upon the great hospitality extended American naval men by the British people.

EGYPTIAN SITUATION IMPROVING.

LONDON, March 23. Reuter's Agency says it learns that telegrams received up to Sunday evening show a continued improvement in the situation in Egypt, but that the Delta region is still disturbed. Bedouins attacked a detachment of British troops in the province of Fayum,

Middle Egypt, but were repulsed with losses.

JEW MASSACRED BY THOUSANDS.

NEW YORK, March 22. The Bolshevik invasion of the Ukraine has resulted in pogroms in which thousands of Jews were massacred, 5,000 being killed or wounded in Proskurov, according to cable messages from the Copenhagen Zionist Bureau, made public here to-night by the Zionist organization of America. Hundreds of Jews were killed in Berdichev, Zhitomir and other places, said the message, which declared the pogroms were instigated by Polish anti-Semites.

LIFTING THE BLOCKADE.

BASLE, March 22. The Austrian Foreign Office has been informed by the Italian Armistice Commission that the Associated Powers have decided unanimously to suppress the blockade of Austria and Hungary, says a semi-official dispatch received here from Vienna.

MAKING PROGRESS.

PARIS, March 22. The Peace Conference Commission on the League of Nations, at its meeting this afternoon, under the chairmanship of President Wilson, completed consideration of eight articles of the League Covenant, the changes being formal. The important amendments concerning the Monroe Doctrine, the Japanese amendment for just racial treatment, and the French amendment relative to the creation of a General Staff, were deferred for consideration at the next meeting, to be held Monday evening at 8 o'clock. The Japanese amendments have been revised so as to be introduced into the preamble and recite the equality of Nations of the States belonging to the League.

LATEST.

GERMANY BRIBING RAISULL.

TANGIER, Mar. 22. An encounter has occurred in Morocco, between Spanish troops, marching from Tetuan towards Daba Kofsh, and some followers of Raisull, according to information received here from native sources. Raisull, Moroccan brigand and former Governor of Tangier, has been reported dead several times. The latest report, however, stated that he narrowly escaped.

SPARTACANS PROMPTING STRIKE.

COBLENZ, Mar. 24. (By the A. P.)—The day of March 25th has been set for a strike within the American occupied area, among workmen in various industries, according to information reaching here. The unrest among the labor leaders is said to be due to the influence of Spartacan agitators.

DRIFTING INTO BOLSHEVISM.

PARIS, Mar. 23. (By the A. P.)—Oswald Garrison Villard, of New York, Editor of The Nation, has just returned to Paris from a week's observation of conditions in Germany, and made a report to the British Prime Minister, David Lloyd George and the American Peace Commissioners, by which they are said to have been profoundly impressed. The drift towards Bolshevism is rapid in Germany, said Mr. Villard today, and it can be stayed only by prompt food relief and the lifting of the blockade, so that trade may begin again, and the idle German factories may receive raw materials as fast as arrangements can be made to pay for them.

EMINENT PRELATE DEAD.

ROME, Mar. 24. Cardinal Cassotto, Bishop of Frascati, and Librarian of the Holy Roman Catholic Church is dead.

BLAMES THE ENTENTE.

BASLE, Mar. 23. Budapest was calm on Saturday, according to advices reaching here from that city. Business was for the most part suspended, but the streets were animated, and posters were displayed everywhere appealing to the people to continue work. The Food commissioner has issued a proclamation saying "as a result of the manner in which the Entente acted, we have allied ourselves to the Soviet republic, and have placed ourselves under the protection of the Soviet troops. We have advised them of our decision by airplane." The Revolutionary Government has appointed commissioners for Budapest, it is said.

How Fogs Are Measured

An ingenious invention for measuring the density and quality of fogs has been perfected by Dr. John S. Owens, of the Meteorological Office. According to his explanation, fog is merely filth suspended in the air, and his appliance takes a record of the atmosphere impurities, but it does not analyse. The records are taken on circular discs of filtrated paper. These discs are spaced off into sectors, numbered like a clock. They are then placed upon a clockwork arrangement after the fashion of a record on a gramophone, and at set intervals during the day a current of air is admitted to the paper records by means of an aperture, which focuses the current on to the part of the disc marked with the time of day. That is to say, at 10 a.m. the air current is focused on that part of the disc numbered 10.

Dr. Owens explained that during the night the records are almost white, denoting comparative purity of air, but towards 5 and 6 a.m., as the workers rose and the fires in homes and factories were lighted, the colour became darker.

The colour grows darker as the day goes on, and then, as the afternoon gradually passes, the impressions get lighter in colour once again, until by 6 o'clock the impression is once more almost white.

The Navy and the Merchant Marine.

Discussing the interdependence of the navy and the merchant marine, Vice-Admiral Albert E. Gleaves recently designated the navy as the backbone of our sea power and the merchant marine as its nerves and sinews. He stated his belief that navy and merchant marine seamen should be paid on the same scale, cared for with the same thoroughness, and subjected to the same discipline. In 1914 the total merchant tonnage in the world was about 50,000,000 tons. The war, chiefly through submarine piracy, destroyed 15,000,000 tons, and the new shipping constructed amounted to about 11,000,000 tons, leaving a shortage of 4,000,000 tons. If this program is carried through, the U. S. will have in 1920-21 some 2,000 ships averaging 10,000 tons in individual displacement and totalling 20,000,000 tons. The cost of this fleet is estimated at four billion dollars—ten times as much as the Panama Canal.
