

War Memorial.

(Communicated Officially)

At what may be described as the final meeting of the Patriotic Association held on the 21st March, a Resolution was passed requesting the Governor to call a public meeting of citizens in order to reconsider the whole question of a Memorial to those who fell in the Great War.

His Excellency having received this request conceives that he can only respond to it either through responsible Ministers or through the Municipal Authorities. After inquiry, he decided that the latter was the best course. He accordingly requested the help of Mr. Mulhally, who is in the Chair of the Council for the moment, and having obtained his cordial co-operation decided to have a preliminary discussion with the Executive of the Great War Veterans' Association before carrying the matter further.

As a result of a very full discussion of the views of the Executive of the Great War Veterans' Association there has been a further general meeting of the Great War Veterans' Association at which the Association as a whole has provisionally affirmed its attachment to a previous scheme for a Memorial, and it has now been arranged at a conference between the Governor, the acting Chief Civic Commissioner and a deputation of the Executive of the Association that action should be taken on the following lines:—

(1) A statement to be sent to the press explaining the position of the question so as to give every one ample opportunity of considering the question raised before a public meeting is called.

(2) The acting Chief Civic Commissioner to arrange with the Executive of the Great War Veterans' Association for a large and representative public meeting at which it is hoped that the women of the Colony should be fully represented at some date early in May. It has been proposed that the Governor should be asked to preside.

(3) The suggestions of the Great War Veterans' Association to be laid before the meeting, not as binding in any way but to be considered with a limited number (say 3) other suggestions if any such are made at the meeting.

(4) A small committee of 7, on the lines suggested by Father Nangle, to be appointed at the meeting with full power and discretion to carry out as seems best to them and at such time as seems best to them any one of the schemes to be referred to them and to take steps for raising the money required.

The whole idea of the public meeting is that there should be finality and with that end it is desired to concentrate attention upon certain definite proposals. It is therefore thought worth while to indicate what proposals might properly be considered at the public meeting. In the first place then the following fresh resolution has been handed in to the Governor by the Great War Veterans' Association:—

"RESOLVED.—That the Great War Veterans' Association of Newfoundland affirms that there should be no further delay in the erecting of a Memorial to the Men who died. That this Association suggests that the Memorial should take form of:—

(a) As a National Memorial to be subscribed to by the people of the whole of Newfoundland, including St. John's, a large scale replica of the Carillon as erected on the Battlements of France and Flanders, this to be placed on the highest point of Signal Hill so as to be visible from both land and sea.

(b) As a Local Memorial, to be erected by the citizens of St. John's, another Monument comprising a naval and military or any other symbolic group to be placed in the City of St. John's."

Secondly, there is the scheme outlined by Mr. R. G. Rendell, C. B. E., in a letter addressed to the press on the 21st of March.

Thirdly, there is a suggestion made by His Excellency the Governor at his meeting with the Executive of the Great War Veterans' Association. The essential element in the Governor's scheme is that there should be some room or chamber in which the names of all the sailors and soldiers of Newfoundland should be recorded in some form. This carries out the central idea of the scheme adopted by the Patriotic Association, at the instance of the Great War Veterans' Association deputation, on the 7th January, 1920, and this could be done alternatively.

(a) If a small building of record with arch or arches attached were built on the King's Bench not far from where the Great War Veterans' Association arch stood on the occasion of the Prince of Wales' visit.

(b) By means of an arch and guard house near the Colonial Building either replacing the iron gates which at present form the entrance, or standing back to the West of the Colonial Building with its own approach from Military Road.

In either case suitable figures representing the Navy and the Army could be introduced and it thought wise the Carillon could surmount both.

It is not now desired to anticipate discussion which should be reserved for the public meeting but it is fair to say that at the meeting of the Executive of the Great War Veterans' Association with the Governor, when this matter was thrashed out in a way that it was never thrashed out before, there was a strong majority of those present who favoured one Memorial in St. John's if there were not sufficient money to carry out 2 Memorials.

Now this is important, because the probability is that there will not be sufficient money to provide 2 Memorials. At any rate it would be unsafe to go on with such an idea, unless there was a strong promise of support from all the outposts in Newfoundland. In any case the Committee should be empowered to delay the collection of the money if they thought that wise.

Finally, it is worth while to remind the public that though there has been great talk of delay on the part of Newfoundland this Colony is in no way singular in its difficulty of making up its mind. There is no part of the British Empire at present where anything in the form of a big Memorial has as yet been decided.

NOTICE OF QUESTION.
