Monroe Candidates Complete Campaign

IN ST. JOHN'S WEEK.

Last night the Monroe candidates Linegar and Browne, held two meetings which were in line with the meetings previously held throughout the district. Sir John Crosbie was on Bell Island and could not be with them.

MEETING AT SANITORIUM.

The first meeting took place at the Sanatorium. Dr. Rendell acted as chairman and pointed out that Sir John Crosbie had been a benefactor of the institution and had given a box for use in going around the coast. Messrs. Linegar and Browne referred to the conditions as present existing in the country, where unemployment is so prevalent, and the young blood is forced to leave our shores to seek living in other countries. The voter present at the meeting displayed great interest in the arguments advanced, and showed by their applause that they were in line with the rest of the country for clean government and on polling day will register their votes for the straight ticket, Crosbie Linegar and Browne.

MEETING AT TOPSAIL ROAD.

At the second meeting which was held at the house of Mr. Peter Cowan Topsail Road, Mr. Peter Murphy acted as chairman and introduced the speakers.

Mr. Linegar was first called on to address the gathering. He reviewed the labor situation in the city and also the mismanagement of affairs under the different Coaker controlled governments, proving to his hearers that an administration that is being supported by men of this type is not able to bring back to the country a return of the happiness that she experienced a few years ago. Mr. Linegar's address was punctuated by applause and at the close he was accorded a generous ovation.

Mr. Browne regretted the absence of Sir John Crosbie, who was on Bell Island, but he felt that his hearers appreciated the desire of Sir John to be present and put his case before them. However, Mr. Browne felt certain that the people of Topsail Road would give the West End their support that all candidates under the Monroe banner are deserving of. The country knows the record of the present administration and it has before it the policy of the Monroe party, which calls for clean government. What steps the electorate will take on Monday rests with the electors themselves, but they owe it to their country and to the coming generations to use their franchise for the improvement of the present deplorable state of affairs. The Government party is backing the Gander proposition, but this is simply propaganda of an insincere character because the Gander will be proceeded with no matter what Government is returned to power. Mr. Browne concluded with an appeal for the party whose motto is a square deal to all, and who are pledged to clean up and keep clean.
