A cotton-picking machine has been devised on lines similar to the vacuum process cleaning machines by J. S. Thurman. The vacuum producing apparatus, driven by a gasoline engine, is mounted on a wide-wheel truck, which is drawn about the cotton field by mules. Each operator has 100 feet of hose with the picker suction tip at the end. It is claimed that each operator can gather 700 pounds of seed cotton per day of ten hours at a total cost of from \$2 45 to \$3 10 per operation per day.
