EFFORTS TO SAVE THE BABIES' LIVES

Figures on Pasteurization by an Expert—Why He Makes the Fight.

New York, July 28. - Nathan Strauss, of this city, delivered before the political economy class of Heidelberg University an address on milk pasteurization, in which he demonstrated by facts and figures the reduction in infant mortality brought about by the system for which he has fought for so many years. Mr. Strauss has extended his work into Europe and it has attracted such attention that he was invited by Prof. Eberhard Gothein to address the students at the university.

Mr. Strauss said that the excessive mortality of infants in their first year and the number of deaths due to consumption have been traced to the use of milk taken from tuberculous cows. A large proportion of the animals are diseased, he declared, and are kept in surroundings which give encouragement to the disease. Dairyman do not take proper precautions to prevent filth from coming in contact with the milk and it is not kept cool while in transit. thus aiding the multiplication of
