IN CROP REPORT

Western Outlook Bright, Despite Intense Heat and Lack of Rain.

TORONTO, July 7 .- The crop report TORONTO, July 7.—The crop report received by Canadian National Railways here this morning from the West, covering the week ending July 2, is, generally speaking, an optimistic one, although it reflects the effect of the intense heat and lack of rain over wide areas before that date. A total of 321 agents reported, and of these 71 recorded the weather as favorable, and 118 reported a need of rain. Agents to the number of 64 showed that recent rain has saved the situation as far as serious damage was concerned in their district. Slight damage from drought is indicated by ten agents, while considerable

Slight damage from drought is indi-cated by ten agents, while considerable damage is reported by four. Hall is mentioned by ten, grasshoppers by six, cutworms by one, and damage from rain by one also. Since July 2, considerable rain has fallen over wide areas in the West, along the Canadian National lines, and it is likely that a great deal of the danger of damage from drought has been removed accordingly.

TO PACIFY MOROCCO

Ex-Austrian Spy and One-Time German Agent Spend Millions.

Calcutta MANY SLAIN IN BATTLES

Only Three Districts Are Said To Continue Holding Out Against Paris Rule.

PARIS, July 7 .- French Morocco will be peaceable enough for an honest citizen to live there by the end of next citizen to live there by the end of next year if the recent French successes against the tribal elements continue. There are now only three districts to be pacified. The first is a small region along the Spanish zone frontier in the north, the second comprises the so-called middle Atlas group, a difficult mountain region, and the third, another bastile mountain section in the south, where the authority of the mountain native chiefs is alone recognized so far.

where the authority of the mountain native chiefs is alone recognized so far.

Already Gen. Aubert, under the direction of Marshal Lyautay, has made considerable progress in the middle Atlas region by conquering the area known as Beni-Ourain. Two French columns have been operating there since April 1, one from the east and the other from the west. These columns have succeeded in meeting behind the mountains, thus completely cutting off the Beni-Ourain tribes from the remainder of the strongly fortified tribes. Three months of daily fighting, raiding and reconnoitring has cost the French army only forty-nine casualties, one of which was an officer who was only slightly wounded, while the enemy's list of dead runs into the thousands.

Eleven outposts have been established along the Nel frontier, embracing more than 10,000 native families, only 1,600 of which still refuse to accept outright French domination. Attention is now to be directed toward conquering the Zais region, where the operations have taken a definite punitive character. If this can be cleared within eighteen months the remaining opposition, it is believed, will be almost certain to col-


