Northwest Mounted Police Toil in Supreme Effort To Rescue Victims.

RIVER CONTINUES RISE Report Conditions Much Worse Than in Inundation

of 1904.

Special to London Advertiser. Winnipeg, May 4.-While squads of Northwest Mounted Police are still toiling in a supreme effort to rescue hund dreds of persons in the low-lying districts about Brandon, Manitoba, the Assiniboine River. which overflowed its banks Monday, continues its inundad tion, menacing that city and the surrounding country for more than a hundred miles.

At midnight the turbulent waters were still rising, while the near-by town of Alexander is reported as being already surrounded and all communication with the outside world at a standstill.

Rises 20 Inches.

Flood conditions west of Brandon along the Assiniboine River have reached alarming proportions, and a rise of approximately 20 inches of water has been noted within the past 18 hours.

While no deaths have as yet been eported, families living in the Brandon flats were forced to flee by night in boats and improvised flats, aided local and district police, and at great risk. In most instances the ater is already up to the housetops, and still rising. When the ak will be reached is difficult to determine. Horses, cattle, domestic animals,

and every type of debris imaginable is going down the surging river. A veritable lake is reported around Virden Valley, while in the Kemnay district the roadways and the entire low country is entirely flooded, in some places only the tops of tall rees and housetops showing.
