CAIRO, March 16.—The proclama-tion of the sultan, Ahmed Fuad Pasha, as king of Egypt teday, was accompanied by the firing of salvos of 101 guns in Cairo, Alexandria and Port Said, and of 21 guns in all the

other provincial capitals.

Field Marshal Viscount Allenby, hitherto the British high commissioner, accompanied by members of his staff, called at the royal palace and congratulated King Fuad, whom he addressed as "Your Majesty."

Well-Known Farmer of Sombra District Arrested by License Inspector.

ALLEGE FRAUDULENCY

Claimed That Man Framed Liquor Robbery on Another Person.

Special to London Advertiser. SARNIA, March 16.—A sensation dent, Dr. Creelman, was dismissed was created in the Sombra district by Mr. Doherty. "I promoted Dr. today with the arrest of Peter Keho well-known farmer, by License Inspector W. J. Coulter, on Warrant charging Kehoe with perjury.

The circumstances leading up to the arrest are of an extraordinary nature, it being alleged that Kehoe deliberately framed a charge against Bush of robbery with violence at Kehoe's home in May last, when 32 cases of liquor were alleged to have been stolen, while at the time Kehoe is said to have had the sum of \$1,-600 in his possession, proceeds of the sale of the liquor to Carmen Mitchell, a Marine City bootlegger, who is held in jail at Sarnia pending trial for robbery at Port Lambton. Mitchell has produced a receipt, alleged to be signed by Kehoe for the sum of \$1,600, and witnessed by W.

Obtain Release of Bush.

The story is strange in several ways, as following the conviction of Bush, who received a sentence of from six to twelve months in jail by Magistrate J. J. Jarvis on June 31, Henri & McNally, Sarnia lawyers, were instructed to appeal the conviction and were successful in obtaining the release of Bush from jail, and as the appeal has never been brought up for hearing, Bush is at liberty and is in the United States, this situation is stated to be without precedent.

O. L. Lewis of Chatham defended Bush at his trial, but the man's friends, after the conviction, retained Henri and McNally to appeal, believing a frame-up had been made. For months the solicitors endeavored to obtain the receipt for the cash, believing that Mitchell held it. He could not be induced to produce it nor give any statement regarding the supposed purchase. Mitchell himself was arrested and extradited from the United States for robbing the Downs brothers of Port Lambton with violence. Mrs. Mitchell retained Henri and McNally to defend her husband, and they were then successful in obtaining the receipt, which is alleged to bear the signature of Kehoe. It is stated that at the trial of Bush, Kehoe and several members of his family swore identification, knowing at the time that the liquor had been sold to Mitchell for disposal in Detroit. Was Second Man.

Another peculiar feature of the case was that Bush was the second man charged with the robbery, Joseph Richards of Sombra having been acquitted of a similar charge a few days previously. Some time previously a relative of Kehoe had been arrested and convicted on a liquor charge, and Inspector Coulter had announced to Peter Kehoe his in-tention of checking Kehoe's stock. It is alleged that Kehoe framed the charge of robbery in order to avoid having to account to the police inspector for the disappearance of the liquor he had held. The magistrate allowed Kehoe out on bail on his own security for \$5,000, with that of John C. McMillan of Sombra for a similar amount.
