ST. ANDREW'S BALL AT THE PAR VILION A GAY BVENT.

St. Andrew's cross flaunted overhead last night, while the sons and daughters of St. Andrew's Society made merry below. The Pavilion was the scene of as gay an event as ever took place within its walls. The reels of old Scotland were revived and given a new atmosphere. To the wild gaiety of the dancers of the heather were added i the allurements o flace, and chiffon and silken skirts. There were the walts and the lancers and the polka and the other dancers of modern concortion to be sure, but the distinctive features of the night were the Scotch reels and the Reels of Tullock, and the jigs of the Hielanman. The rugged merriment of the good old peasant dancers crept out through all the elaborations of an ordinary social function, and the St. Andrew's hall of 1894 was an event long to be remembered.
