#### Men Well Satisfied

Dominion Department of Agriculture. Dairy Division.

Speaking of his experience with ow testing for three years, one farmer near St. Hyacinth, Quebec, recently expressed himself as very well satisfied. He had good reason to be, for in June this year his 9 cows averaged 1,203 pounds of milk each, a total of 10.830 pounds Three years ago the average was only 823 pounds, the total over 7,411

In other words, his income from the nine cows was thirty-four dollars greater in one month this year.

Instances very similar to this may be found in every county where cow testing has been taken up intelligently. Near Listowel, Ontario, is a Toledo, O. | herd of 16 cows that gave on the average of 2,700 pounds of milk per cow more than three years ago. The addition of four hundred and thirty two dollars per years to one's income, without increasing the number of cows, is a substantial and tangible result of intelligent weighing and sampling.

Again, at Wooler, Ontario, is a herd now giving 8,307 pounds of milk per cow, an increase of almost 3,000 pounds per cow.

Record forms for milk and feed, and a herd record book, will be supplied free on application to the dairy commissioner, Ottawa.
