The half-penny sterling is 1 cent; and the penny sterling is 2 cents. The pound sterling may be counted at 5 dollars.

Money in Canada consists of bank bills, gold and silver coins, and bronze in single cents. In British Columbia the bronze coin not in circulation, though legal.

The Dominion of Canada paper money, also the paper money of the Bank of British North America and the Bank of British Columbia, pass freely in Province in notes from \$1 to \$100. These are payable in gold. United States paper money is not used in the Province, but passes in trade at silver rates.
