

BELGIUM.—THE RABOT GATE, GHENT. (La Porte du Rabot).

Ghent is built upon 26 islands which are joined together by 80 bridges. During the 15th and 16th centuries. Ghent was considered the most important town in Flanders. Here was born John Ganut (or Ghent), the son of Henry IV. The Counts of Flanders were inaugurated at Ghent, and there, in 1467, Charles the Bold, the last Duke sinction of machinery being the principal industries.
