Bat, the laity ought to bestir themsolves. It is they who should at onee raise finds for the College, both by way of domations and regular ammal subseriptions. No church is doing its duty which does not make strenuous, self-denying efterts, for the training of its own elergy. Our venerable Archbishop has been left too long to beas the burden and heat of the day in respeet of St. John's (ollege. It has heen with him a labor of love, and no one will ever know all that he has done, and is doing, for the college as an institution, as well as for individual students. But for his large hearted generosity, many a stadent would never have been able to finish his college course, and the church would have been ah the poorer therefor: Now is the time to show our appreciation of his work, by makine better provision for the carrying out of higher education in the West. Nothing that could be suggested would so fill his henrit with real gladness as to see the College getting the support it so riehly deserves at the hands of churehmen.

Let those who have not yet seen the Jamuary number of the College Magazine obtain a copy; let them give it their most thoughtful consideration: let them, above all, carcfully read Mr. Hewison's trenchant editorial; and then sey if we are not within the mark when we lay the onus of the college deficiency on the shoulders of churchmen themselves.
