The buying was based on an article in yesterday's Tribune written over the signature of Cuthbert Mills, saying the bituminous coal trade was never in a better condition, that consequently stocks of the bituminous coal carrying roads and more excelelly. coal carrying roads, and more especially Norfolk & Western, were bound to sell at higher figures.

The traders found that there was little or no outside following of their selling movement, and that little or no liquidation was taking place, consequently when they attempted to cover the market advanced rather costly.
