Wheat.—The market is dull and easy. Cars of red and white are quoted at 60c north and west. Manitoba wheat is rather firm. No. 1 hard is quoted at 61c to 62c.

Barley.—Barley is quiet at 51c to 51 1/2c for No. 1 and 25c for No. 2. Nominal at 48c outside. Corn.—Steady at 25c for mixed and 26c to 27c for yellow.

Things were dull on the local street market this morning. No grain offered and the deliveries of dressed hogs were nil. About 10 lots of hay sold \$12 to \$14. Straw nominal.

MONTREAL MARKETS.—MONTREAL, June 9.—Grain.—There is some inquiry for the market. Feed, No. 2 white, in store, 77c to 28c; oats, mixed, 25c to 26c; rye, No. 2, nominal; barley, feed, 35c to 36c; rye, 45c to 47c; buckwheat, 17c to 18c.

BUFFALO MARKETS.—East Buffalo, June 9.—Cattle.—104 cars through and 120 on sale; market opened slow for all but good handy dry fed butchers; heavy open steers, \$4 15 to \$4 40; good to prime, \$4 25 to \$4 30; light to medium, \$4 to \$4 25; good fat light butchers, \$3 85 to \$4; mixed butchers, \$3 40 to \$3 75; old to good fat cows, \$2 to \$3 65; bulls, \$2 80 to \$3; good butchers, \$2 to \$2 40; spring calves, \$2 to \$2 50; calves, \$3 35 to \$3 60; fresh cows and springers lower at \$17 to \$40 per head; veals, \$3 25 to \$4; selected, \$4 25 to \$4 50.
