

## FOLLOW-UP: RECOMMENDATIONS

1. To enhance overall reader understanding, prepare additional interpretive commentaries to complement currently unaccompanied tables.
2. To facilitate quick and clear grasp of overall trends, provide appropriate graphs to accompany tables.
3. To place Latin America and the Caribbean (LAC) and its links with Canada in a broader perspective, incorporate, where appropriate, corresponding global and geographic/economic group indicators.
4. To present additional perspectives on LAC and its regions, develop supplementary tables, as appropriate, with country data weighted by population.
5. To better illuminate significance of data, prepare further tables illustrating evolution of relevant ratios (e.g. school enrolment and economically active population as percentages of, respectively, the corresponding age and total population cohorts).
6. To facilitate comprehension of broad trends, group, present, and analyse data on basis of cross-cutting issue areas (e.g. women's status).
7. To identify possible correlations among key variables surveyed (e.g. between poverty levels and population growth), prepare and comment on comparative material.
8. To keep the survey bank up-to-date and maximally useful, add data and commentary as new information becomes available.
