That all the words after the word "That" be struck out and the following substituted therefor:—"this House, while prepared to adopt effective measures for the protection of the territory of Canada, declines to concur in the said resolution, because it contains provisions tending to impose upon Canada, which has no voice in Imperial affairs, a share in the external responsibility and the naval defence of the Empire outside of Canadian territory, the only portion of the Empire over which the Canadian people may exercise any political or constitutional authority."
