CANADA SHIPPING ACT—AUTHORITY TO INSPECT
SUBMERSIBLES

Question No. 2,986—**Mr. Forrestall:**

Does the Minister of Transport intend to place before Parliament legislation in the way of amendments to the Canada Shipping Act to provide for the inspection of (a) all submersibles operating within the jurisdictional purview of the government, regardless of gross tonnage (b) submersibles owned or leased by the government and, if so, on what date?

Hon. Jean Marchand (Minister of Transport): The Canada Shipping Act gives authority for the issue by the Governor in Council of regulations dealing with the construction and equipping of all ships regardless of tonnage. However, the act also provides exemptions from annual inspection by a steamship inspector in so far as small vessels are concerned. The need to verify whether or not such vessels do comply with the regulations has been met by means of unscheduled and occasional surveys for enforcement purposes which are not prohibited by the act. In the case of submersibles, it is considered that there would be no problem in carrying out surveys on a similar basis when construction and equipment regulations have been finalized. Hence, there is no intention at this time to put forward an amendment to the act removing such vessels from the sections dealing with annual inspection exemption. Submersibles owned or leased by the government would come under the jurisdiction of the Canada Shipping Act and its regulations if they are registered, and as this can be done by directive it is not considered necessary to amend the act in this respect.
