

(4) To make better provision for the decision of cases respecting Goods seized and detained for breach of the Customs Laws :

(5) To empower the Governor in Council to transfer, for a time to be named in the Order, to the list of Goods which may be imported free of duty, articles (whether natural products or products of manufactures) used as materials in Canadian manufactures, and to grant a Drawback on the duty paid on articles so used or a specific sum in lieu of such Drawback.

Resolution to be reported.

The said Resolution was accordingly reported, read a second time, and agreed to

Mr. *Bowell* then introduced a Bill No 78 to amend the Act 40 *Victoria*, Chapter 10, intituled : " An Act to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting Customs ; which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading, *to-morrow* .

The Bill No. 58 to provide for the salaries of an additional Judge of the Court of Queen's Bench, and an additional Judge of the Superior Court in the Province of Quebec, was read a third time, and passed.

The House went again into Committee of *Supply* .
