On June 5 a loan issue of bonds, totaling \$5.500.000, made by the City of Baltimore, Maryland, failed of acceptance largely owing to the tightness of money. The city than offered the bonds at 90 but found few investors, and it then occurred to Mr. Charles H. Grasby, publisher of The Baltimore Sun newspaper, that it might be possible to sell the bonds to small investors over the counter. Starting with a \$10,000 block of \$100 bonds, no difficulty was found in disposing of them, most of the applicants being women-many carrying market baskets. At the close of the sale on June 16. The Sun Lad sold almost a million's worth of the bonds instead of the \$10.000 first undertaken, and in consequence the city has withdrawn its offer to sell at 90, many other small investors having gone direct to the commissioner of finance.

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., June 19 .-Canadian Press.) - Leprosy steadily increasing in the United States, according to Dr. Rupert Blue, surgeon-general of the United States public health service. Dr. Blue's address at the American Medical Association's convention today told of the continued propagation and spread of the disease.
