ERROR PAVED WAY FOR NEWARK WIN

Leafs Are Beaten Again—Enzmann Puzzle to the Locals.

Hollander's error on a thrown ball to catch a runner at third in the first inning paved the way for three runs, which let Newark grab the third of the series by a score of 3 to 1 yesterday. It was a ladies' day, and about 500 fair fans saw the Leafs go down to defeat.
