Then $n$ forco of 10 , 000 men was sent fro:n Manchooria, the intent. ion being to attack the diggers as soon as the ice began to break up on the Amoor, and they could uo longar cecape by the siverinto Russian territory. Had they done this tiere would have been much bloodatied, fot the diggers are well armed and very detamined, and as dis. coverers, concider they have an absolute prop. erty in the diggings. Possibly Russia would have found in the confusion an excuse for interventionina district which she nust greatly regret is not within her own borders.-Bunter's Mfayazine.

## The Mink.

The mink is not nearly so destructive un animal as is generally supposed and much oi the mischief usma!ly charged to minks in Manitola is performed by other auimals, such as skumk and weasels, ot which there areseveral varicties in this country. The mink seldom leaves renuing streams, although it is sonctimes found about ponds and lakes. Not being a swift ruuuer, it is quickly overtaken when on the open prairie by wolves os foxes which are ever on the lookout for moving objects and consequently the mink seldom leaves its favarite haunts, where, if attacked, it can quickly find a holc amongst the fallen timber or cscape into the water. As the principal food of the mink is fish, it mosily frequenis crecks and rivers where its supplies are abuniant. In winter this animal upeads most of its time in the hollow space which is formed by the raier sinking away from the ice, and, like the otler, it usuolly comes out for a run on mild snowy morrings. Next to the otter the mink is the most Leautiful fur carrying onimal in che Northwest and along the wooded valleys of the ruoning streams $i t$ is found in coissiderablo uumbers at this scasou of the year or somewhat carlie. Mink furs are just now oat of fashion and a little protection would encourage and increase production, if the law could be enforced. During the last fow ycars a vast number of these interesting little creatures have been caught out of seasou both by white men and Injians. A camp is made by eome streau where the minks are numerous, traps are yet here a.il ilin along the creck, for several miles up anul dunn and nearly all the aninals are quickly captured. As trapping can be carried oa more casily before the water freszes and as cach trappec sceks to be first, the fur is talen before it attaius its proper gloss and tbickness. In a few ycars feshions will change and instead of fifty cents a good mink skin will, again, be worth four or five dollars. Tho authorities should hy all means provide $a$ close time fur minks and not only fine ineavily those who trap out of scsson but seize all the unprime shins fousd in the hands of dealers.Birtle Obscrier.
