Escaping Gas Burns Underground and Explodes at Intervals.

Belleville, Feb. 9 .- (Special.) -A very eculiar and dangerous state of affairs exists on Front-street. Some days ago there was an explosion of gas at the corner of Front-street and Victoria-avenue, supposed to come from a leak in the gas main. The explosion did some little damage in the store of Don. G. Bleecker, druggist. Since then the employes of the gas works have been endeavoring to find the leak, but so for without the leak, but so far without suc

This afternoon a bystander named Wm. Hulley, who had been twice warned away, succeeded in dropping a lighted match down the excavation, setting fire to the escaping gas the flames coming up with a rush and burning the man's moustache and hands. Since then the escaping gas has been burning underground, and keeps exploding like thunder at intervals. The situation is serious.


