PREMIER SCOTT AT OTTAWA BRINGS GOOD NEWS ALONG

Crop Prospects Bright, Money Easy, Business Booming and Everything Lovely.

Ottawa, June 12.—(Special.)—Nearly the whole of the Saskatchewan cabinet has been in the capital. Hon. Walter Scott, Premier, arrived here to-day and met Mr. H. Lamont, attorney-general, who arrived yesterday, and Hon. Mr. Motherwell, minister of agriculture and provincial secretary, who has been in the seat about a fortnight.

Premier Scott brings glowing reports from the western country. He says the crop outlook is very promising. The recent drought, of which alarming reports came east, affected only the extreme north and west. This is why the fall wheat fields suffered. Money is flowing freely and men who invested a short time ago are frequently able to sell at four or five times the amount put into shares.

The premier says the prospects are bright for immigration. The activity in railway circles, created by the Grand Trunk Pacific, Canadian Pacific and Great Northern, adds much to the general volume of business in the province. There are also many applications to the government for new railways under provincial charter.

The taking over of the offices and other administrative machinery from federal government is about complete, and Saskatchewan is getting along well with its autonomy. The legislature met this year in the old chamber, a couple of miles out of Regina, where the territorial assembly had its deliberations, but the government is now preparing to erect new parliament buildings in the city.

Premier Scott will be here several days and will confer with the federal government on matters which can better be determined by personal intercourse. One of the things he will ask is that the Grand Trunk Pacific be required to give Saskatchewan a station on the corporation limits and not two miles distant, as proposed. This town, which is a disappointed aspirant for capital honors, is still aggressive, and has ambitions to be a great city. Mr. Scott believes its chances are good.

Many of his former colleagues of the house of commons greeted Mr. Scott with hearty handshakes and were pleased to note his excellent appearance. Premier Rutherford of Alberta, who arrived east some time ago, will probably start for home to-morrow.

Mr. Scott's presence is possibly not unconnected with the various cabinet changes that are imminent. Hon. Messrs. Scott, Cartwright and Peterson are to retire immediately after the prorogation, and one of the new ministers will be chosen from Saskatchewan or Alberta; among other appointments decided on is the choice of Mr. Power of Quebec as minister without portfolio.

HAPPENINGS IN HAMILTON TO STOP SUNDAY FUNERALS

Request to Public Which May Be Followed by Imposition of Double Fees.

Hamilton, June 12.—(Special.)—The cemetery managers discussed the question of Sunday funerals this evening and agreed to use their influence to discourage the custom, and passed a resolution requesting the public to abstain as far as possible from burying their dead on the day of rest. If this does not have the effect of lessening the number, it is probable that a double charge will be made for all labor done in connection with funerals held on the Sabbath.

Will Compel Agreement. The special committee named to confer with the Caledonian Power Company has been called together for Wednesday evening. The aldermen will decline to make any concessions, and will apply to the city council for a municipal board for an order compelling the company to live up to its agreements.

At a meeting to be held next Saturday at the Royal Hotel, the travelers of the city will make arrangements for their annual picnic.

WELL-KNOWN MINE ON MARKET. Stock of Buffalo Mines, Limited, Offered to the Public.

A. E. Osler & Company, 43 Victoria-street, Toronto, are offering a limited quantity of the stock of The Buffalo Mines, Limited. This mine has been in active operation for the past year, and is probably the best equipped mine in Cobalt. The mine, well-developed veins have been discovered, operations have been confined to two veins, on which shafts have been sunk to 50 and 60 feet, respectively, and about 250 feet of tunneling done.

Charles L. Denison, the President of the Company, estimates the mine at \$75,000. Messrs. Osler & Company state that they have, personally, had an assay made of the ore taken from the sixty-foot level. This assay showed a value of \$252 to the ton.

Five cars of ore have been shipped since the start of May last, from which large returns are expected, and it is believed that dividends will be forthcoming within two or three months. The stock is offered to the public at par, and if the estimate made by the superintendent of the company of the month's output is retained, the company can easily pay dividends of over 33 per cent. per annum.

PLAGUE IN INDIA.

Over Fifteen Thousand Deaths Reported in One Week.

Washington, June 12.—The constant ravages of epidemics in India are shown in reports received by the public health and marine hospital service. The latest one, being for the week ended April 23, last, showing 17,835 cases and 15,833 deaths from plague that took in India, 211 cases and 1942 deaths from plague in Bengal, and 126 deaths from cholera, 167 from plague and 99 from smallpox in Calcutta.

Cholera in Philippines. Washington, June 12.—An official summary of cholera in the Philippines from the outbreak last August, and up to April 21, last, shows a total of 4093 cases and 3114 deaths. During that period there were 3810 cases and 2882 deaths from that cause in the provinces, and 283 cases and 252 deaths in the City of Manila.

No Cholera in Russia. Washington, June 12.—The treasury department has received information that no cholera has been reported in Russia since December, 1905.
