#### ARE THE WOMEN DROWNED?

Amherst Island Ladies Went Out in a Skiff—Boat Found Bottom Up—Man Killed.

Kingston, Ont., Dec. 1.—Peasants are entertained that two women, Mrs. McPhee and a friend, who left Amherst Island in a skiff this morning, have been drowned. The skiff, bottom up, was found on Salmon Island. No trace of the women can be found.

Dr. William Walker, veterinary surgeon, was this morning kicked on the face by a horse. The bridge of his nose was broken. Joseph VanAlstine, a resident on the Woodburn-road, Pittsburg, met a sad death at Seely's Bay yesterday. He was driving a team of horses, when they took fright and ran away. He sustained injuries which resulted in almost instant death. Deceased was 24 years of age, and well known and respected in the township.

#### YOUNG TRAIN-WRECKERS.

Three Boys Tried to Do Damage and One Was Caught—No Serious Damage Resulted.

Amherst, N.Y., Dec. 1.—Three boys, aged 12 and 13 years, this morning attempted to wreck a West Shore fast express train in a rock cut between Mineville and Indiana Castle, by placing railroad ties upon the track. The train was stopped for very serious damage resulted. Two of the boys escaped, but the third one, Charles Leuber, aged 13 years, was arrested. Officers are in search of the boys wanted, and it is supposed they are in hiding somewhere in the country.

#### At the Sign of the Scales.

City Crown Attorney Harry announced in the Police Court yesterday that the charge of child desertion preferred against Mary Elizabeth Stuart of 9 O'Hara-avenue, had been withdrawn.

David Neilgan pleaded guilty to a charge of maliciously injuring the property of J. David, and was fined \$5 and costs or 30 days.

For being disorderly on Sherburne-street, Martha Young and Elsie Thomas were fined \$1 and costs or 30 days. The latter abused the Magistrate and court officials, and her sentence was increased to six months.

Walter Nicholson of 8 Stanley-place, who has given his wife and family a lot of trouble lately, was fined \$1 and costs or 30 days.

For trespassing on the property of the C.P.R., Arthur Crowley of Seaton Village was fined the usual \$1 and costs, and committed to jail for a month.

The car was so overcrowded that a passenger who had to ring the bell twice before the car stopped was carried a block and a half past his stopping place. As he was crowding his way out of the car he observed: "The only way to remedy this state of affairs is to elect E. A. Macdonald as mayor." This remark was received with "Heer, heer," and applause by all who heard it.

#### Monson Makes a Note of It.

London, Dec. 1.—The Paris correspondent of the Evening News telegraphs to his paper to-day that the French ambassador, Sir Edmund J. Monson, the British Ambassador to France, will shortly apply for a prolonged leave of absence as a protest against the attacks made by the French press on Queen Victoria and the Prince of Wales.

### OCCUPATION OF ZAMBOANGA

Steamer Salvador Has Arrived at Manila and Gives the Details of the Operations on Mindanao.

#### CALIXTO ASSASSINATED NOV. 15.

He Was Deceived and Shot by Filipino—Government Established Under U. S. Sovereignty.

Manila, Dec. 1.—The steamer Salvador, from Zamboanga, Island of Mindanao, which has arrived here, brings details of the occupation of the town by Commander Very of the United States gunboat Castine. The revolutionists in Mindanao were led by Alvarez and Calixto, who left Luzon some time ago, and, for the last seven months, had been stirring up the people and winning a considerable following. The commercial depression and the lack of food resulting from the islands' blockade, set the people against the revolutionists, and Calixto, a freeman and the real leader of the revolution, by Middel, Mayor of the town, was secured Calixto's presence in return, and when Calixto was within a distance of 50 yards from a point where the Mayor's guards were stationed, the latter fired a volley, killing Calixto instantly. Middel accompanied Very to the Castine and arranged with Commander Very for the occupation of Zamboanga. Commander Very asked that Datto Mundi, with 500 of his followers, stationed on a neighboring island, come to Zamboanga. The following morning, Middel raised the American flag over Zamboanga, the insurgents offering no resistance, and evacuating the town. The Castine was seized with 21 guns, and Commander Very landed a hundred blue-jackets and took possession of the town and fortifications. Datto Mundi's men arrived in the afternoon. They were armed with wooden shields and swords, and were used on picket duty.

On the afternoon of Nov. 20, Middel called a meeting of the local chiefs, who formally deposited Alvarez as leader of the revolutionists in the island, and elected Middel President of the Insular Government established under American sovereignty and control.

#### The Advance Being Pushed.

Washington, Dec. 1.—General Otis' advance to the War Department today show that the advance into the interior is being vigorously pushed, and the American troops continue to drive back and disperse the scattered bands encountered. He states that Capt. Warwick, 18th Infantry, was killed in an engagement at Passa, 101½ Province, on the 28th instant.

#### SMUGGLING OF CHINESE.

The District Court at Albany Will Have an Important Case Against Some People.

Albany, N. Y., Dec. 1.—When the United States District Court, Judge Cox presiding, convenes in this city in January, probably the most interesting case to be tried will be that of the alleged conspirators, who are plotting to aid in the importation of Chinese laborers into this country. Nelson W. Potter, William M. Christman and May Soy will be charged with conspiring to smuggle Chinese across the Canadian border at \$50 a head.

Hadley, of the past thirteen years' superintendent of the Jerry McAuley Water-street Mission, New York, will speak at the meeting of the Toronto Temperance League in Massey Hall to-morrow (Sunday) afternoon, ought to be sufficient to attract a large and interesting audience. Mr. Hadley was a convert of the Jerry McAuley Mission, and his remarkable experience in mission work since makes him a speaker of unusual power. Anyone who has read his little booklet entitled "My First Drink and My Last Drink," can form some idea of the address that may be expected from him on Sunday. Holmes Cooper of Chicago, an old friend and a singer of exceptional ability, will take part in the song service. Mr. B. E. Hall, superintendent of the Freed Victor Mission, will occupy the chair.

#### The Bank Clearings.

New York, Dec. 1.—Bank clearings at the principal United States cities for the week ended Dec. 1 show total clearings \$1,457,280,156; decrease of 1.5 per cent., as compared with the corresponding week of last year. Outside of New York city the clearances were \$527,037,011, a decrease of 10.2 per cent.

#### At the Dominion of Canada the clearances were as follows: Montreal \$14,922,448, decrease 2.6 per cent.; Toronto \$3,844,109, decrease 1.4 per cent.; Winnipeg \$3,280,156; Halifax \$1,521,507, increase 24.5 per cent.; Hamilton \$753,124, increase 10.1 per cent.; St. John, N. B., \$772,285, decrease 10.8 per cent.; Vancouver, \$559,597, increase 30.1 per cent.; Victoria, \$451,020, decrease 30.4 per cent.

#### Toronto Island Association.

The meeting which is to be held on Monday of the above association will be open to all island residents, and it is hoped that several important matters in connection with the island will be taken up, the most important being in regard to the erection of the proposed gas plant at the south end that portion of the island known as "Mugg's Landing." It will be held at the Rossin House.

#### France and Brazil.

Paris, Dec. 1.—Negotiations are about to be opened with the view of giving Brazil a reduction of about 10 francs on the tax on coffee, on condition that the French products shall be given the most favored nation treatment. Should the negotiations fail, the maximum tariff will be applied to Brazilian coffee.

#### Wages Raised Ten Per Cent.

Full River, Mass., Dec. 1.—All the cotton manufacturers of this city, represented by the Full River Association, decided that they would grant an advance of 10 per cent. instead of 5 per cent. in wages, beginning on Monday, Dec. 11. In all about 20,000 hands will benefit by the raise.

### MORGAN IS IN IT YET.

The Gobbie of the B. & O. by the Pennsylvania Has Not Put the Wall Street Magnate Out.

New York, Dec. 1.—The reported deal between the Pennsylvania Railroad and the Baltimore and Ohio is startlingly significant, says the Press to-day. Several months ago, when Mr. Morgan and his chief executive, President Stinson, were in London in the interests of the Southern Railway, a rumor became current that an arrangement had been made by the Baltimore and Ohio would either pass under the control of the Southern or enter into an alliance with it. That would seriously embarrass the Pennsylvania. The Wall Street broker, and vice-president of one of the systems to make enquiry into the matter, and reported a confirmation of the statement. The vice-president was one of his regular customers, and at the time was long of a block of Southern Railway stock.

It is common knowledge in the street that J. Pierpont Morgan, for his fee for reorganizing the Southern Railway, accepted \$1,500,000 of the common stock at \$9 a share. The highest point reached since was 14½. The Press does not agree with some wiseacres that Mr. Morgan has closed out his Southern common. He expects soon to get a great deal more than 14½ for his stock, and the Pennsylvania and Baltimore and Ohio deal.
