## SECOND DAY AT THE SHOW.

Record-Breaking Attendance to See

Prize Horses Receive  
 Their Awards.

GOVERNOR-GENERAL ATTENDS TO-DAY

The Long List of Blue Ribbons Won  
 on Friday, and Program for  
 Closing Day.

The attendance at both afternoon and  
 morning horse show performances yester-  
 day proved record-breakers, and the crowd  
 was a much more fashionable one than on  
 the opening day. The gowns were more  
 beautiful, and there were a larger number  
 of out-of-town visitors present, including  
 Hon. Sidney Fisher, Minister of Agriculture,  
 who evinced great interest in the  
 judging of the various classes. Late again  
 against the Governor-General's at-  
 tendance, for early in the afternoon a wire  
 was received by Secretary Stewart Houston  
 that, owing to the terrible fire at Ottawa,  
 he would not be able to attend until Sat-  
 urday afternoon.

The music in the afternoon and evening  
 was furnished by the band of the 48th  
 Highlanders, under the leadership of Mr.  
 John Slater.

At the evening performance both the la-  
 dies' musical and physical drills by the  
 Queen's Own Rifles were repeated, and  
 with even more success, especially the  
 ladies' ride. Miss Gibbons did not take  
 part, and Miss Haney, a petite maid of 16,  
 ably filled her place.

The ladies of the Red Cross were again  
 much in evidence, and did a rushing busi-  
 ness with their bouquets of flowers and in  
 the tea room.

## Judges Task a Tedious One.

The classes yesterday were again well  
 filled, and the judges' task was a tedious  
 one. All day long they had their hands  
 full in awarding the ribbons, which was  
 done without a single kick. As a well-  
 known horseman said, it was no disgrace to  
 be beaten by the winners.

The morning was devoted to the handling  
 of the thoroughbred and heavier class. There  
 were a lot of good ones shown,  
 and classes in all being brought  
 into the ring. The sires were a good  
 one, and was won by Morris, Stone and  
 Wellington's Belle II. This firm also car-  
 ried off the blue ribbon. The other classes  
 were smaller in comparison, but equally as  
 good.

The afternoon judging was commenced  
 by the handling of the thoroughbred stallions,  
 a class that had five entries, and was won  
 by Mr. Fuller's Wyndham, a fine cut of a  
 horse. George Wyndham's entry carried  
 off the blue ribbon, while Mr. Redhead's  
 Romanee only took third.

The sweepstakes for the best hackney  
 stallion, any age, had two entries, and  
 there was no doubt as to which would win  
 when they came into the ring. Mr.  
 Beth's Squire Rickell was head and shoulders  
 over the other, and carried off the  
 prize.

**Sweepstakes Ribbons Awarded.**  
 The sweepstakes for the best pair of  
 draught horses was won by Mr. Ewing's  
 team, a fine-looking pair of geldings, stand-  
 ing over 16 hands. The firm of J. & O.  
 Morley of Guelph were awarded the sweep-  
 stake ribbons for the best pair of Clydes-  
 dales.

The combination saddle and carriage  
 horse and ladies' saddle horse classes had  
 17 and 18 exhibitors each, three  
 each. The ladies' saddle horse was won  
 by J. W. Holman, who had a mare fit for  
 a carriage in his cart.

The saddle class, not exceeding 15.2, had  
 a large entry, and this was again won  
 by Leading Lady, at the head of the  
 pack. Not a single horse in this class  
 cleared the jumps in the first trials. At  
 the jump of Mr. Pepper's Fox was first,  
 John Collins second, and Beck's entry fell  
 back to third place. The judging of this  
 class took nearly an hour before the judges  
 decided on the winners.
