TAXATION OF IMPROVEMENTS

Linjustice of Assessment System Subject of Rattepayers' Protest.

Upwards of 60 ratepayers attended the public meeting in St. Andrew's Hall last night, called for the purpose of taking measures to bring pressure to bear on the Ontario legislature to have the assessment law amended and thus abolish what is claimed to be an unjust taxation of improvements. The meeting was opened by Controller Graham, who was subsequently replaced by Samuel Moore, president of the Toronto Trades and Labor Council. The speakers included W. A. Douglas, A. W. Roebuck, A. C. Thompson, E. W. Helton, A. Studholme, D. W. Kelly, A. J. Bajteman and William Ward, all of whom favored single tax as the only remedy for the supposed evil.

A resolution was passed urging the labor; and other organizations to use every effort to keep the iniquity of the present system of taxing the improvements on land, while the speculator escapes, before the attention of the public until the fnjustice is rectified.

Hunter is believed to be the man who ran off with the coat, and McCue the person who interfered with Watson when he attempted to capture the thief. hotel, and thence to a shed in the




