The local residents furnished the visitors with hot coffee. During the early hours of the morning the rain ceased and the men turned to catch a moment's rest and sleep. The Toronto men were quartered in the Exhibition buildings at the city hall.

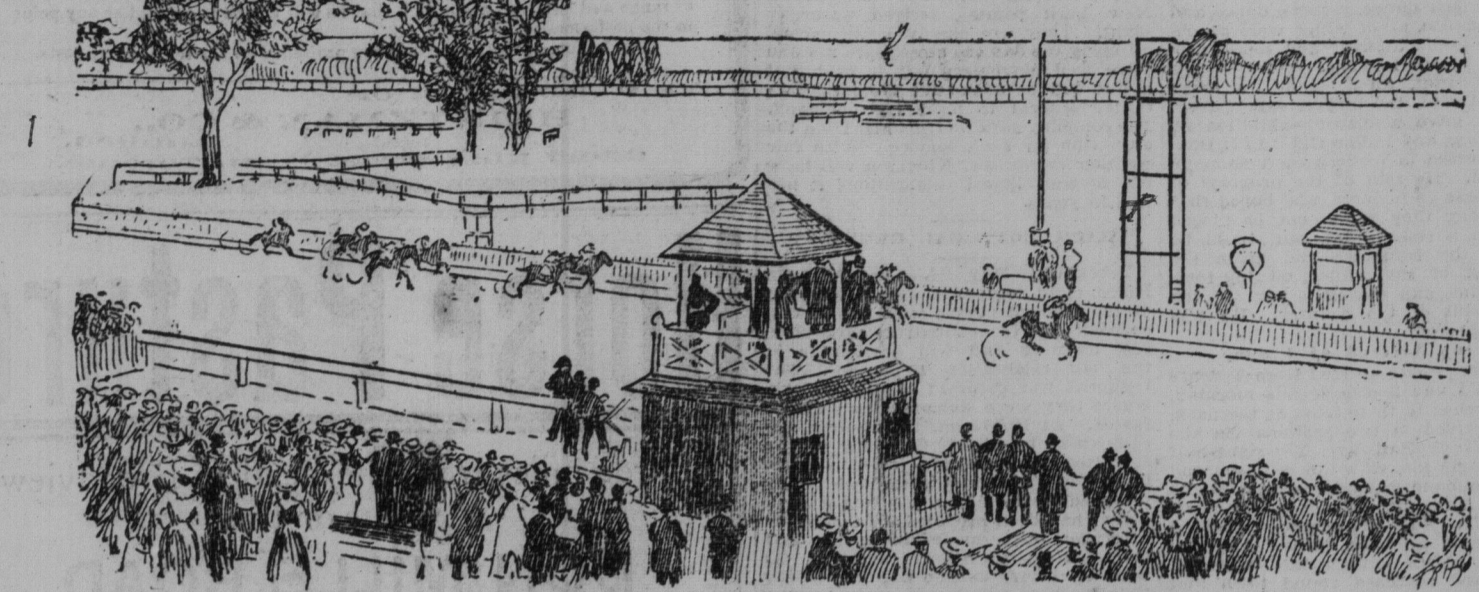
ASTIR EARLY SUNDAY.
