

Incorporators are Florentine Lafayette Snively, Hamilton, gas expert; John Franklin Green, St. Catharines, gas expert; Harold Arthur Sidner, St. Thomas bank accountant; Thomas George Moore of Caledonia, gentleman, and Manford Schier, Dunnville, Florentine Snively, John Franklin Green, Thomas George Moore, Harold Arthur Sidner and George L. Goodwin of the city of Hamilton constitute the present directors of the company. The capital stock of the said company is the sum of \$1,600,000, divided into 1,600,000 shares of \$1 each.
