EXCELLENT RACING ON GET-AWAY DAY

Butt Hale Lowers His Mile Record at Syracuse—The Summary.

Syracuse, N. Y., Sept. 14.—The get-away day program of the Grand Circuit meeting here today was featured by several exceptionally good races and an exhibition mile against time by Butt Hale, who paced the circuit in 2:04, lowering his own amateur mark by one-half a second.

Abbie Dryad, driven by Geers, captured the 2 1/2 mile race in two out of three heats. Poor Man, the favorite, had the race won in the last heat, but broke in the stretch.

The second race, 2 1/2 mile, was won by Echo Direct, three-year-old, driven by Echo Direct, who was an added starter. His mark now is 2:08 1/2. Joe Y. McDonald, who had a walkaway in the first two heats of the 2:00 trot, amateurs, while Lord Lyndon won the 2:20 trot for three-year-olds in two straight heats.

The 2:20 trot found the entrants finishing in the order in both heats. Lord Lyndon, Lord Todd, First Virginian, Louis Guy, Lord Todd fought hard at the finish in both encounters.
