Series of Impressive Coronation Events

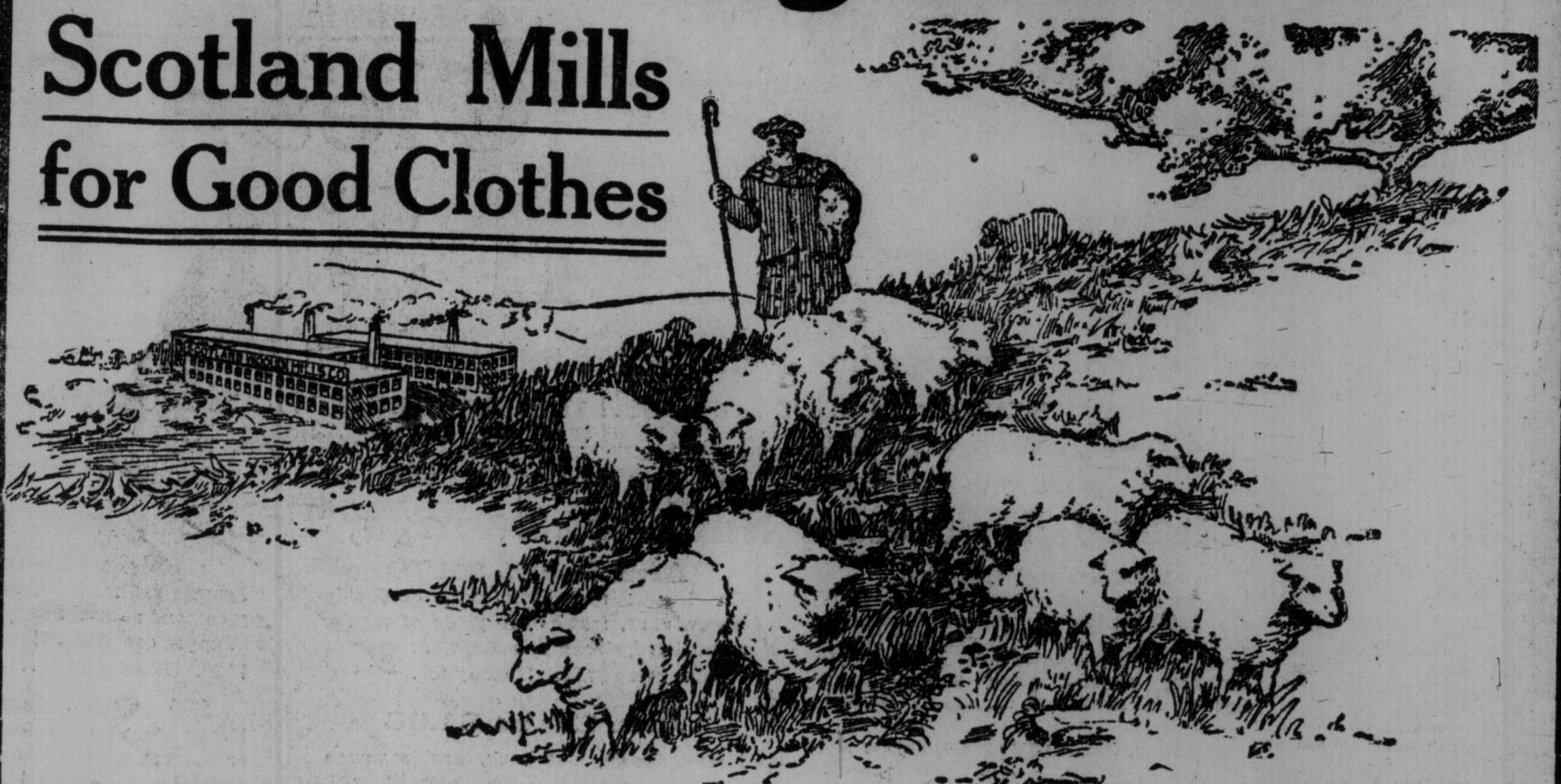
For a Month Their Majesties Will be Kept Busy Receiving Acclaim of Loyal Subjects.

LONDON, June 24.—The impressive ceremonies of coronation day have ushered in a series of coronation events of almost daily occurrence for the next month up to about July 21. Beginning with the naval review at Spithead today, these coronation receptions and festivities keep the King and Queen moving through the kingdom. The royal visit to Ireland from July 7 to 12, the investiture of the Prince of Wales at Carnarvon on July 13, and the royal visit to Scotland from July 17 to 21 are some of the principal events.

Great Events in June

It would have been impossible to select a more appropriate date for the coronation of King George than one in the month of June, or perhaps than the very day of the month which has been chosen. It was in June that the King was born, and also the Prince of Wales.
