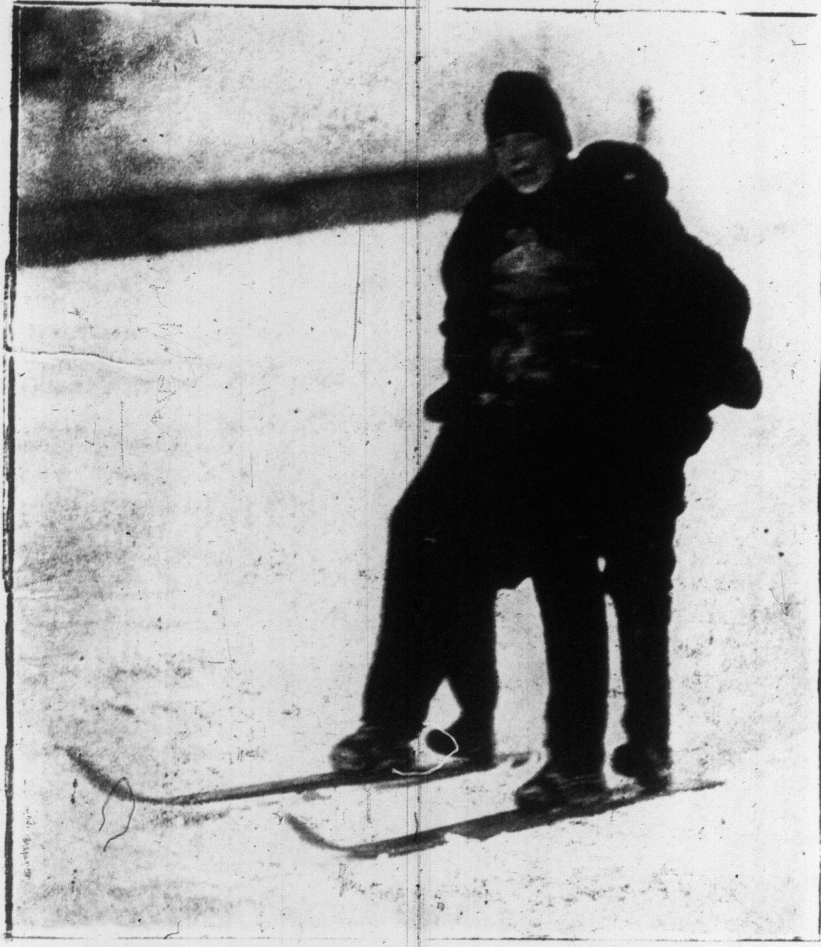

The following review of the celebrated German dialect singer's new play is taken from Fort Worth Record during his southern tour: "It happened in Potsdam" is a bright comedy with more body than anything Wilson has played in the last few years. His humor is more evident and the author was kind enough to split up the spotlights with the heroine, which brought the farcical talents of Miss Laura Lemmers into play more than once. The absurd complications revolving about a letter written in the youthful folly stage by the Countess Viola to Metz marriage is full of three acts pretty full. The letter is captured finally by Phoebe, a Virginia girl, and a cousin of the countess. But she captures the heart of Metz as well and gives him her own in return in order to round out the charming love story and complete the record for Metz as an international heart snatcher. He must know more ways of winning a woman than George Damerel, Metz must.  
The company has a number of new faces and a lot of familiar ones. Miss Laura Lemmers being the most notably valuable addition. She knows how to portray a heroine with a sense of humor as well as an ability to wear smart gowns and hats. Sartorially speaking, the play is full of delightful surprises, beginning the minute Metz himself appears with canal boat shoes and a calico turban; "My Lady Fair" and "She Loves Me, She Loves Me Not" are two charming new songs by Wilson. The tenor sings with all

his old abandon and purity of voice and the regret and deepening of tone that mark his present work are more than acceptable. An Al Wilson song is distinctive ever. It has lift and tenderness, and a simple fragrance as true as the color of a rose, and the rendition of his ballads, new or old, nearly always stops the progress of the play for a while as it did last night, while the audience demands repetition of the thing it loves.

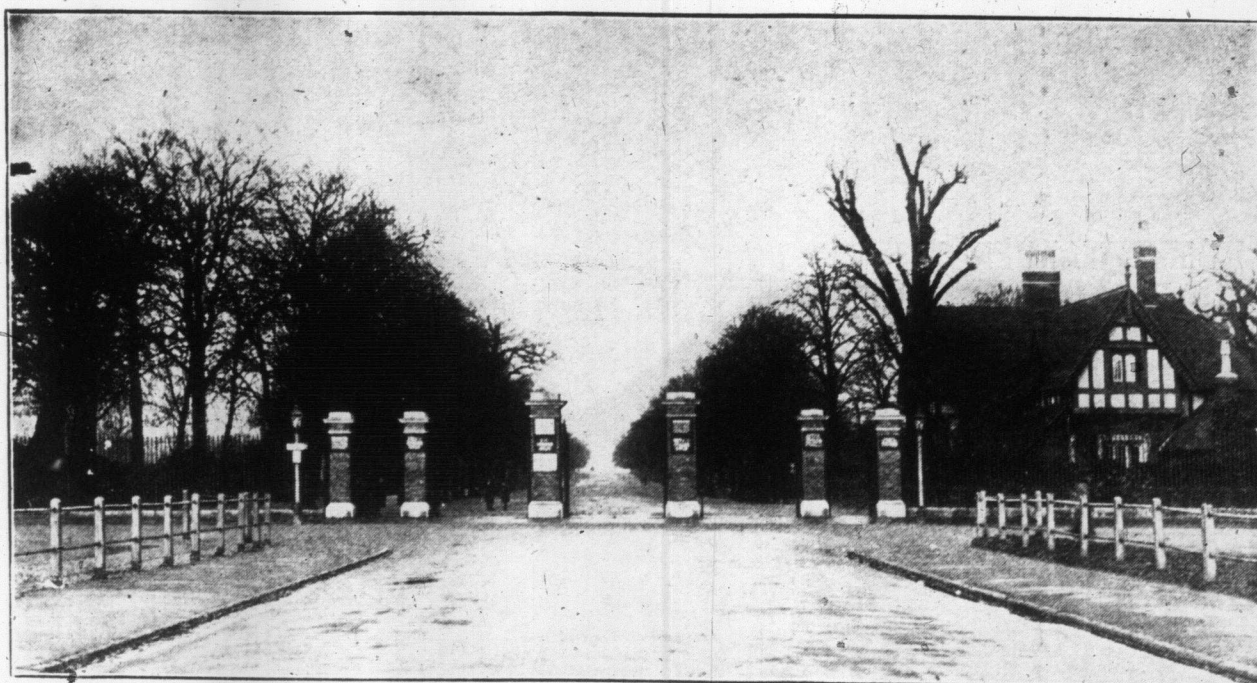
**BLEACHING OF IVORY**  
To bleach ivory ornaments or piano keys the following method works well. The ornaments are first washed or "soaked" if possible in a bath of unslaked lime, which has in it a few ounces of bran and water. This should make a paste solution if properly mixed, and will bleach the ivory which is discolored or stained. It should be rubbed off with a cloth and the ivory dried in magnesia powder. After a few minutes a few strokes with a cloth gives the ivory a brilliant polish.
