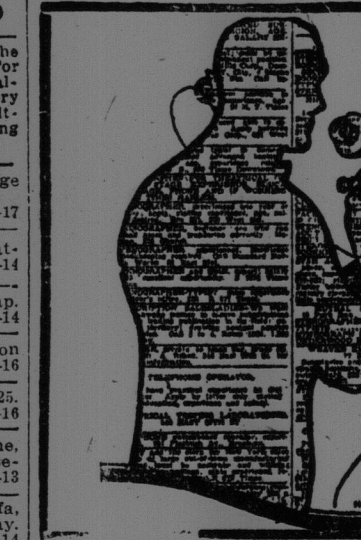

## WANT ROAD PUT IN TRUNK GLASS

**Loch Lomond Association**  
Executive Holds Fall Session

Action is Discussed to Improve Still Further Fishing in Lakes

The fall meeting of the executive of the Loch Lomond Protective Association was held on Tuesday night in the Log Cabin Fishing Club. A. F. Johnston occupied the chair.

It was felt by the members that while the fishing in the lakes has shown an improvement, much better results could be obtained if different methods were adopted in distributing the fry into these streams where they were placed in the lakes each season. A committee composed of A. F. Johnston, Bert Gilmour and G. Sinibaldi, was appointed to act with Mr. Catt, an official at the fish hatchery, and make a survey of the streams emptying into Loch Lomond with a view of making suitable plans for the placing of the fry into these streams where they would be protected and have a much better chance to develop than if placed indiscriminately in the lake itself.

Another subject which developed considerable discussion was that each year, more especially in the spring and early summer, numerous fishermen visit these streams and took away catches regardless of the legal limit of size. The attention of the Government will be brought to this matter.

**ROAD MATTERS DISCUSSED.**

Road matters were also discussed and while it was agreed that the road to Loch Lomond was considerably improved, it was felt that the highway is of sufficient importance to be classed as a trunk road and receive more permanent construction.

Mr. Johnston and Mr. Sinibaldi, permanent residents of Loch Lomond, are doing valuable work for the association, of which A. Fred de Forest is president and Bert Gilmour, secretary.

The line, owned mostly by the City of Belfast, has been under lease to the Maine Central for 55 years, which road will not renew the lease expiring Jan. 1, after which time the city will operate the line.
