

## STILL ARGUE OVER SPEED AND SIZE OF THE GREAT SHIPS

The controversy about the relative speeds of the Cunarder Mauretania, the White Star S. S. Majestic and the U. S. Shipping Board S. S. Leviathan is still an important one in the eyes of shipping men. A bulletin issued recently by the White Star Line claims that the Majestic holds the world's record of five days, six hours and thirteen minutes, and states that the Mauretania's best official time for the same distance, eastbound, was five days, seven hours and thirty-three minutes.

A despatch from Berlin to the New York Commercial tells of inquiries made at the plant of Blohm & Voss, in Hamburg, where both ships were built. Experts of the company gave their opinion that the Majestic formerly the Bismarck, was 56,331 registered tons, while the Leviathan, now the Leviathan, was 54,281 tons. They also said that the Majestic was more than five feet longer than the Leviathan. They expressed surprise that the American measurements could show 59,950 tons for the Leviathan unless extensive changes had been made in her.

## TRAFFIC BLOCK MEANS MILLIONS

London Loses £20,000,000 a Year By Congestion in Streets.

London, Aug. 1.—(By A.P.)—Twenty million pounds annually is thrown to the winds as a result of traffic delays and congestion on the streets of London, according to experts in statistics. This large sum, which is said to be a conservative estimate, is sufficient, however, to arouse the indignation of many London newspapers, and to open a campaign against the present plight of the street traffic.

The members for London in the House of Commons have agreed to take the matter up and present a bill designed to regulate all classes of traffic in the city.

The most difficult problem in London is that of the omnibus and other heavy motor lorries. There are about 3,700 passenger buses in operation in the city and the number is steadily increasing. The congested traffic has caused a considerable loss to the bus owners, as it is impossible for the machines to make any speed through the mass of other vehicles. The situation is becoming worse, according to the newspapers, and it now takes a bus three minutes longer to traverse the Strand, about half a mile in length, than it did six months ago.

A report shows that 34,500 vehicles pass Hyde Park Corner every 12 hours beginning at 8 o'clock in the morning, while Piccadilly Circus accounts for 42,000 and Trafalgar square for 41,000.

At the present time only in the City of London proper, an area of less than a square mile, is heavy traffic prohibited on some of the main streets. On all other streets any class of vehicle may wander at its own will.

There have been many attempts by royal commissions and select committees to deal with the problem, but these have been unable to find a solution.

OLD BISMARCK LETTER DEMANDED GOOD BEER

Missive Written in 1851 Took Brewer to Task Because His Quality Was Not Maintained.

Berlin, August 1.—When Bismarck's beer was not exactly to his liking, the Iron Chancellor was very unhappy and was not slow to let his displeasure be known. A hitherto unpublished letter of Bismarck's to Herr Levenstein of the Berlin Tivoli brewery has just been printed by the Berlin Tagblatt, complaining of the quality of the brewery's beer.

The letter was written Nov. 5, 1891, from St. Petersburg, where Bismarck was Prussian Ambassador. Bismarck complained that Levenstein's quality of beer was not keeping up as well as that of the previous year, and urged a change in the methods of brewing. He said his beer was working in the bottles and was as muddy and as sour as English ale.

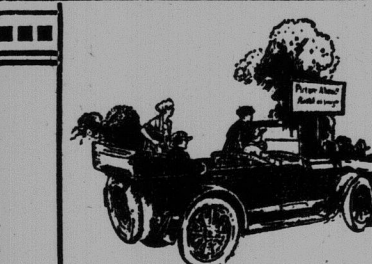
