ALDERMEN IN CAUCUS THIS AFTERNOON BOTH WERE DEDICATED 50 YEARS AGO

State Practically Arranged—Russell, McGoldrick, Wigmore, Hayes, McLeod, Kierstead and Ether Smith or Potts Heads of Boards

While the caucus of the members of the new common council will be held this afternoon to determine the make-up of the various boards and committees in advance of the organizational meeting on Monday, it has been practically decided before hand who the chairman will be as every member has been contacted by the different aspirants and while some have declined to commit themselves, it is generally believed that enough support has been pledged to make the result a foregone conclusion. The new chairman will probably be—
 Safety Board—Alderman Russell.
 Public Works—Alderman McGoldrick.
 Water and Sewerage Board—Alderman Wigmore.
 Treasury Board—Alderman Hayes.
 Ferry Committee—Alderman Smith or Potts.
 Bills and By-laws—Alderman McLeod.
 Appeals Committee—Alderman Kierstead.
 The voters, who receive \$80 for their services, will probably be divided among the various aspirants. Alderman McGoldrick and Kierstead are the most popular names in the caucus for the support of the council for the year. The members of the council are: Only seventeen city representatives can sit in the municipal council, it is probable that one or two new men will be elected to remain away.
 The frame-up with regard to the election, while it is probably not final, has the support of the majority, it is not by any means acceptable to some of the members and it is likely that the meeting this afternoon will be lively.

GIRLS OF EIGHTEEN IN COURT ON CHARGE OF STREET WALKING

Two well-dressed girls, eighteen years of age—Annes Hamilton and Martha Arsenault—were before Judge Ritchie this morning in the police court on a charge of street-walking, wandering about without being able to satisfactorily account for their presence in the streets about midnight, for which they were arrested by Policemen Marsden and McNamee. They presented a sorrowful appearance this morning, and cried bitterly on being brought into court.
 "These crocodile tears have little effect on the court," said His Honor, addressing the Hamilton girl. "You have not late for years now. Perhaps if you had a neat black hat on your head, a less flashy sailor collar, and no light dress coat, you would not attract so much attention from the men in the street."
 "You say you were at a dance and your companion says she was at a party—well, these dances in cheap halls about the city are causing many young fellows and girls to go to ruin. They're dances in name only. No respectable girls will be seen strolling about the street with fellows at the hours when decent people are in bed. The fellows you were with, they don't seem to be around this morning to help you out of your trouble."
 Policeman Marsden told of having seen the two girls go into the ladies' entrance of the Ottawa hotel last night, while two male companions went into the business office, and asked for rooms which they had engaged by telephone. They were told that all the rooms were taken, and they could not have any. Meanwhile the girls had gone up to the third story, and were in a dark hall. Later they were arrested.
 Policeman McCollum said he had known of the Hamilton girl and another with two youths coming from the Gem dining room about 11:15 o'clock one morning, and that night she said she had been in the Socialist hall in Mill street.
 Both girls were sent before until their parents could be heard from.

ENLARGE MONASTERY OF GOOD SHEPHERD IN WATERLOO STREET

The Monastery of the Good Shepherd is to be considerably enlarged and improvements are to be made to increase accommodation and allow the sisters of the order to continue in their good work along extended lines. They have been quietly working for many years for the reformation of wayward girls, as they have done in their houses in all parts of the world, and their aims have been enlarged to include a certain number of children in whose advancement they are interested. It has been found necessary to increase the size of the buildings and the work of construction is to be commenced at an early date.
 It is contemplated to have the proposed extension three stories in height, 109 feet in length, and 40 feet in width. An important addition to the laundry plant is to be made, and it is planned to place the chapels in the new wing, and to use the top floor for the dormitories.
