NEW HIGHS MADE AT THE OPENING

Records Established in Wall Street—Buying of Broad Character.

New York, June 23-Establishment of opening of today's stock market, with low priced rail and public utility shares leading the advance. Southern Railway, "Katy" preferred, and B. M. T. all touched new top prices. Buying was of a broad character, with a good demand or speculative issues.

The Canadian sugar market has been very much unsettled during June and the prices have changed frequently. The wholesale rate is, however, only five cents higher today than it was on

Montreal, June 23—Canadian Industrial Alcohol accounted for about three quarters of the transactions put through during the first hour's trading of the Montreal Stock Exchange this morning. This issue came out unchanged at 29, Saturday's closing price. Of the balance of the Montreal Power and Brompton were the only issues to register any price changes. The former came out with a week end gain of ½ to 170%; while the last named registered an advance of % to 31.
