MORRIS WILL FORM A GOVT.

Invited by Governor MacGregor to Do So

HE ACCEPTS

Will Announce Personnel of His Cabinet Next Week

ST. JOHN'S, N. F., Feb. 26.—It was officially announced today that Sir Edward Morris, the opposition leader, has been invited by Governor MacGregor to form a ministry in succession to the Bond government which resigned yesterday. Sir Edward has accepted the invitation and will announce the personnel of his cabinet before the legislature meets next Thursday.

Sir Edward Morris was born at St. John's, N. F., in 1859. He was educated at St. Bonaventure's College and the University of Ottawa. He was called to the bar in 1885, and entered into the practice of law. He was subsequently elected to the House of Assembly in 1890, and was re-elected in 1894, 1898, and 1902. Printed on grey, green and brown papers, the figures are reduced accurately to scale and also colored with atmospheric effects. They are suitable for individual or collective firing, and can be adapted for full size ranges as well as for miniature ranges.

The bullet target constitutes roughly one fifth per cent of the training of the foreign conscript. The Solane battle target is stated to solve the serious want of range accommodation for training the Territorial Army.

BRITISH COUNCIL ADOPTS NEW SYSTEM FOR TEACHING EYE TRAINING, DISTANCE JUDGING AND RAPID FIRING.

LONDON, Feb. 27.—The Army Council have just approved the Solane target for military training in Britain and the Colonies. These are the inventions of Mr. E. J. Salane, and are designed to take the place of the bullseye which was formerly condemned by the Council in October 1907, and has now practically been abandoned by all nations for war training.

In all but the final stages of an action battles are now fought at very long range and riflemen may be dangerous at distances up to 2,000 yards and over. They are no longer distinct marks, even when visible, and the moving targets of a battlefield are seldom visible long enough to permit of deliberate aim.

Eye-training, distance judging, and rapid fire are the three essentials of war training in marksmanship, and it
