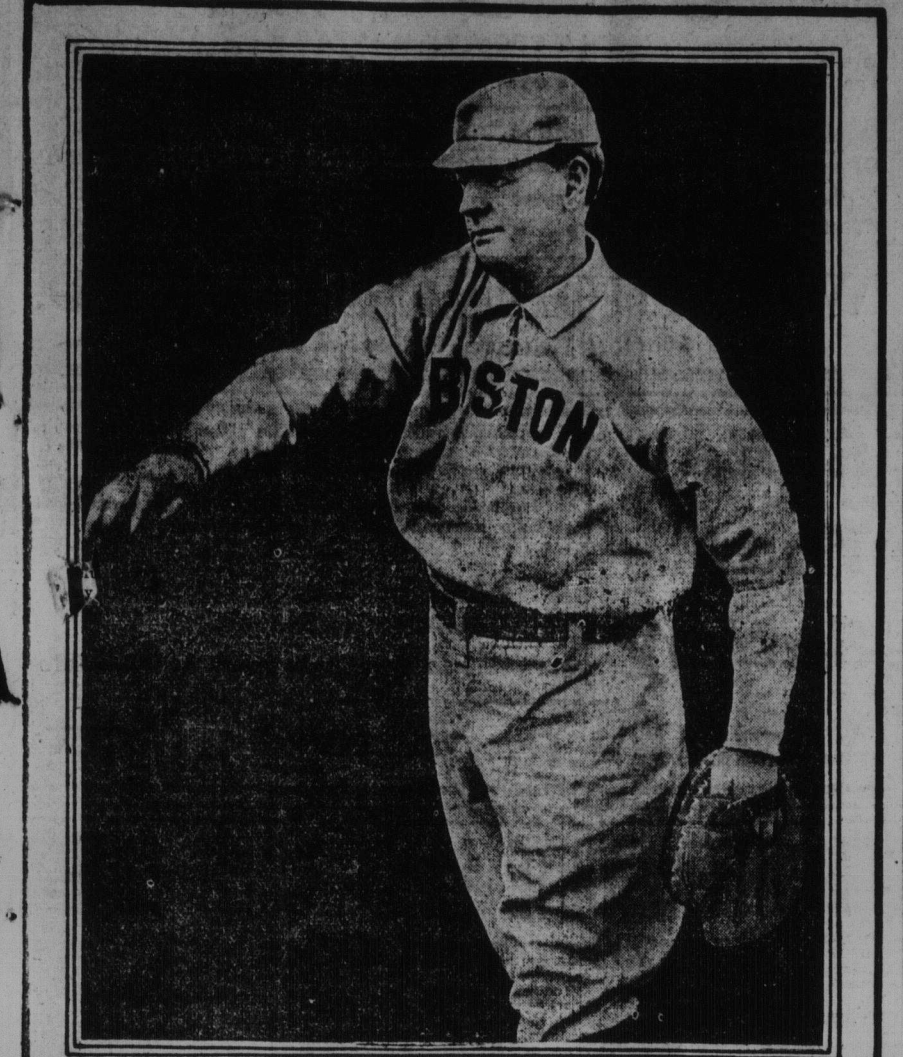


FORMER PROVINCIAL BALL PLAYER IS NOW MANAGER OF BOSTON RED SOX
