Routine Business In Local House

Many Bills Introduced During Short Session—Mr. Upham Gets Information About the Valley Railway—Mr. Wilson Introduced Bill to Provide Plebiscite on Commission.

Special to The Standard. Fredericton, N. B., March 9.—Provincial Secretary Fleming today announced his intention to deliver his budget speech in the Legislature next Tuesday.

The House was in session all the afternoon, but spent the time in routine business and tomorrow will also be taken up with routine work. Fredericton, N. B., March 9.—The House met at 3 o'clock. Mr. Hart reported for the committee that the address in reply to the Speech from the Throne, had been presented to the Lieutenant Governor and submitted His Honor's reply which was read by the Speaker.

The Valley Railway. Q.—"Has the government, or any member thereof received from such person, firm or corporation an offer to construct the proposed Valley Railway?" A.—"The government has had negotiations with some persons and firms with regard to the building of the proposed St. John Valley Railway and several offers have been made some of which involve a modification of the act passed at the last session. As parts two and three of that act are not yet in operation, not having been proclaimed, it is felt by the government that no good purpose would be served and that the undertaking might be actually delayed by stating the names of such persons, firms or corporations at the present time."

The House in Committee. The House went into committee of the whole with Mr. Sproul in the chair. The bill to incorporate the relief committee of the town of Campbellton was passed with slight amendments.

Provincial Guides Exhibit in Madison Square Attracting Attention—Sightseers Gaze at N. B. Wood Life.

New York, N. Y., March 8.—At the best sportsmen's show held in years in the east, the modest exhibit of the Provincial Guides' Association of St. John is attracting and creating interest.

In spite of a magnificent setting of a western mountain scene in which cow boys ride down from the forest, large crowds pause to ask questions in front of an old fashioned wickiwashee of spruce poles and boughs. Directly facing the entrance the huge pair of a bull moose catches the eye.
