**TAFT THOUGHT TO BE NEGOTIATING TREATY WITH CUBA**

Washington, Feb. 12.—President Taft, it was reported today has begun the negotiation of a new reciprocity treaty with Cuba.

Secretary of State Knox has held a number of conferences with Senator Rivers, the Cuban Minister, in the drafting of a new convention, especially in connection with the duties on sugar. The Cuban minister declined today to discuss his activity in this regard, but it is understood that Cuba, expecting present sugar duties to be diminished, feels there may be a necessity for a readjustment of the preferential rates given the Republic.

Much of the data necessary for the negotiations of a new treaty already has been secured and it is said that an informal understanding has been reached between the United States and Cuba as to possible action by Congress as well as the President.

**TREASURE OF ST. JOHN'S GULL**

**Frozen to Ice, Freed by His Mates—Nature Faker Put to Shame by Boston Episcopode.**

Boston, Feb. 10.—O say, Baron Munchausen, listen to this! Gather round, ye biologists and harken to the tender tale of the unfortunate gull, which, imprisoned on an ice floe, was released by the labor of a corps of 50, maybe more, willing workers of its own kind, yesterday.

Every Truthful James of T Wharf will vouch for the verity of this relation. It is not a tale for nature-fakers.

The venturesome bird, lured by the shimmer of a cake of ice which floated on the ebbing tide in the harbor, past T Wharf, swooped down upon it yesterday, and in a twinkling was frozen to the surface. It flapped its powerful wings unavailingly and rent the concave of Heaven with cries of "Help" and "Fire."

The harbor, you will understand, is filled with broken ice from the Charles and Myrtle Rivers, and that the plot may be understood, it is well to chronicle that T Wharf is the rendezvous of flocks of gulls.

The language of the gull is not the smooth, mellifluous speech of the Mediterranean slopes which Byron loved so well; it is a symphony by an orchestra in which the motif is derived from the harsh notes of a tin can and coal sliding down a metal chute.

Therefore when the gull's fellows saw his plight there was confusion so much was confounded that it made the Tower of Babel seem like a melting serenade by Schubert.

Meanwhile over the gull the flock of rescuers sailed majestically or gyrated like mad. The tidings were screamed far on the soft wind and almost as quickly as one could say "Jack Robinson" there were hundreds of gulls fluttering around the unfortunate and telling him to hold on.

The tumult and shouting were heard on the wharf, and the mariners gathered there trained their glasses on the little tragedy on the ice and saw a marvellous thing indeed.

Scores of gulls moved by a common impulse to the crashing paddle wheel and used their bills and claws as pickaxes and levers to free the bird confined. Slowly, O so slowly, the ice was broken by the battalion of rescuers; slowly the ice diminished in volume and with a triumphant pean, after the corps worked a long time, according to veracious witnesses, Mr. Foolish Gull was released with nothing but some experience and a pair of cold feet.

For a moment or two, a poetic soul said, the bird lay as if exhausted on the bosom of the water. Then, cheered by the presence of its mates, it tried its wings. It was free! Then, like the lark at Heaven's gate, it spread its pinions and soared gloriously toward the sun, followed by all the flock.

A moment or two after the gull was released the craning paddle wheel of a ferryboat ground the ice in which it was imprisoned into thousands of fragments.

If the story has any moral at all, it is that not only in politics but in the gull business as well, does it pay to have a lot of efficient friends.

**Patent Medicines EXCLUDED FROM U.S. MARKET SOLD IN CANADA**

Ottawa, Feb. 12.—It is understood that the Minister of Inland Revenue will introduce a bill this session putting stricter regulations than are now embraced in the pure food and drugs act on the sale of patent medicines in Canada. It is alleged that under the present legislation many preparations forbidden in the United States are sold in Canada. The regulatory fee of \$1 on every such preparation will also be rigidly enforced, it being stated that not more than a fifth of the 60,000 patent medicines and remedies sold in Canada are registered.

**TORBAY CUT IT TWO IN COLLISION WITH STEAMER WYCHWOOD**

Hull, Eng., Feb. 12.—The steamers Wychwood and Torbay were in collision off the entrance to Hull harbor during a fog today. The Torbay was rammed amidships and almost cut in two, sinking within a few minutes. Seven members of the Torbay's crew were drowned and the remainder landed here by the Wychwood.

**LIKELY TO BE FEW FIGHTS IN QUEBEC CIVIC ELECTION**

Quebec, Feb. 12.—The nomination of candidates for municipal honors in Quebec City took place this afternoon. Mayor Drouin was re-elected by acclamation.

As a result of the recent amendments to its charter the City of Quebec will elect 20 aldermen instead of 24. At least fifteen of the 23 will likely be elected by acclamation.

**TRIBUTE TO MEMORY OF FATHERS OF THE WHALING INDUSTRY**

New Bedford, Mass., Feb. 12.—A statue commemorative of the men who made this city famous as the headquarters of a great whaling fleet is to be given to the City of New Bedford by former Congressman William W. Crapo. Mr. Crapo announced today that the statue had been designed by B. L. Pratt of Boston and would represent a whaleman in the act of throwing a harpoon from the boat of a whaleboat. The statue and pedestal will be of bronze and will be placed on the grounds of the free library.

**MAY BOSE UNDER THE ST. LAWRENCE**

Ottawa, Feb. 12.—The scheme for construction of a tunnel under the St. Lawrence at Montreal from St. Lambert to Jacques Cartier, involving an expenditure of several millions, was laid before the government by a Montreal deputation today. A government subsidy is sought, but details of the undertaking have not yet been worked out.

**NO OBJECTION TO MEN ACCEPTING GOLD WATCHES**

Washington, Feb. 12.—Secretary of State Knox recommended to Congress today that Captain P. H. Ueberroth and Gunner Karl Johanns, of the Revenue Cutter Service be permitted to accept gold watches from the Canadian government for their bravery in rescuing the crew of the British steamer S. A. Fownes on December 16, 1910.

**PHYSICIAN DIES IN CONSULTATION WITH A PATIENT**

Providence, R. I., Feb. 12.—While conferring with a patient in his office today, Dr. Wm. K. Kirby, a prominent physician of this city, was stricken with apoplexy and died almost immediately. Dr. Kirby was born in Springfield, Mass., 42 years ago. He was formerly treasurer of the Providence baseball and polo clubs.

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND CEDULATIONS.**  
Any person who is the sole head of a family of any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the bounding Land Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, brother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and at least \$5 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section acreage his homestead. Price \$20 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to carry homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$250.00.
