

## AN ELECTORAL RE- 67 YEARS AGO

When There Were No More  
Votes Than Some of the  
Larger Parishes Now Con-  
tain.

Shediac, March 19.—Mr. R. C. Tait, the well known merchant and shipper of Shediac, in looking over some of his father's old papers recently discovered the Westernmost returns of a provincial election held in 1850, or 67 years ago. Westernmost then had four members in the Legislature, though the total vote was not larger than that of some of the parishes at the present time. The returns of the 1850 election are as follows:

Gilbert demanded a scrutiny of Chapman's and Botford's vote. Chapman was unseated and a new election ordered. Albert J. Smith, afterwards Sir Albert, was elected.

Chapman and Botford lived in Sackville. Botford was the grandfather of Dr. R. L. Botford of Moncton. Hamilton, Babin and Simpson were from Shediac. Simpson was the grandfather of John A. McDonald, President of the Amherst Pianos Ltd., Amherst. Steadman was a Moncton man, while Chapman, Landry and Gilbert were from Dorchester. Landry was the father of the late Chief Justice P. A. Landry. Hon. D. Hanington was the father of A. H. and T. B. Hanington of St. John, and of Major Charles F. Hanington of the Construction Battalion, recently in St. John, and was grandfather of Mrs. John V. Young, F. E. and Charles Hanington of that city.

Sir Albert Smith was the father of John W. T. Smith, ex-M.L.A. of Moncton and uncle of Dr. E. A. Smith, M. L. A. elect of Shediac.

## GERMAN HEAVY GUNS HAVE BEEN STRANGELY INACTIVE

Stewart Lyon Says There is Feeling Short of Elation Among  
Canadians in Trenches That Winter Has Definitely  
Gone.

Canadian Headquarters in France, March 19. (By Stewart Lyon, special correspondent Canadian Press).—There is a feeling little short of elation among the Canadians in the trenches now that winter has definitely gone, and that they have come out of the trying ordeal of the winter trenches in the physical condition and excellent morale. A trip along the front today revealed the strong hope that the enemy would not repeat his retreat, but would stay and put up a fight. The Canadians are not doubtful about what would happen if Fritz stays. There is no boasting, because they know that the Germans are the front line men, but the Canadians are willing to be put to the test against them. The German heavy guns have been strangely inactive during the last day or two compared with ours.

The recent overwhelming victory of the loyal Conservatives of Carleton county will have a dampening effect on the aspirations of the would-be leader of the Liberal faction of New Brunswick, even the P. Carter, the widely heralded saviours of the province had made their appearance on a Hardland platform and endeavored to show that the people of the county and that of which they are apostles, would be the best for this country.

The smashing victory of Hon. B. Frank Smith and W. S. Sutton last September, as well as the emphatic endorsement of the Hon. Minister of Public Works, is sufficient evidence of the feeling of the people of Carleton county; and when the people of this county are added to the position of Mr. Frank Bluster Carvell would seem to be that of a man on a precipice with a high gale of public opinion blowing against him.
