




Finances May go to Smash. Berlin, Thursday, March 27.--(By The Associated Press).--Germany is not bankrupt, because it has the pos-sibility of work, Dr. Scheiffer, German minister of finance, told the corres-pondent today in discussing the finan-cial situation. "But," he continued, "she will become bankrupt, so far as it is possible to say at present, when-ever the possibility of working is taken away. "The financial outlook simply dis-appears into nothingness in case of an unfavorable peace that does not leave us an opportunity to recover our equilibrium." Dr. Scheiffer, repeated the German plaint that delay in making peace increases the danger of Bolshevism, but expressed optimism for the fu-ture if Germany is able sto obtain food and raw material. 
