Galf of St Lawrence—Newfoundland—Establishment of a Fog Whistle at Cape Ray—The Dominion Government has given notice that a steam fog whistle has been creeted at Cape Ray. Newfoundland, and was put in operation Oct 16. The whistle is situated ¼ mile east of the lighthouse, and during thick weather, fogs and snow storms, will be sounded for 10 seconds in each minute, leaving an interval of 50 seconds between each blast. The whistle will probably be heard from the following distances: a calm weather, or with the wind, from 10 to 15 miles. In stormy weather, or against the wind, from 3 to 6 miles Bay of Fundy—Establishment of a Fog Whistle on Machias Seal Island—Also, that a steam fog whistle has been creeted in the visinity of the two lighthouses on Seal Island, Bay of Fundy, and will be put in operation Dec 1. During shick weather, fogs and snow storms the whistle will be sounded so as to give two blasts of 5 seconds' duration in each minute, leaving an interval of 25 seconds between each blast. The whistle will probably be heard from the following distances: In calm weather or with the wind, from 10 to 15 miles. In stormy weather, or against the wind, from 3 to 6 miles.
