We have to mourn the loss by death since our last annual meeting of two members, viz: Mr. James Tibbits, a life member for 44 years, and Mr. T. Inglis Poston, also a life member, of 16 years standing.

The Anniversary Service was held in the Cathedral on St George's Day. Wednesday 23rd April, the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Quebec, preached the sermon, Very Reverend Dean Norman D.D., Revd. H. J. Petry and Revd. Lennox Williams assisting in the service; the musical portion of which was under the direction of Mr. E. A. Bishop, the ladies and gentlemen of the Cathedral Choir and others assisting, to all of whom the Society is most thankful for the valuable aid rendered on the occasion referred to. The collection in aid of the charitable fund amounted to \$53.67.

The Committee suggest to their successors the desirability of arranging a scheme for the regular retirement annually of one third of the members of the Committee of Management, so as to permit of the younger members of the Society serving upon the committee, thus interesting a larger number of members in the work of the Society than is the case at present. To make any change in the by-laws Article 5 of the Constitution provides that the President or one of the Vice Presidents, and at least 25 ordinary members shall be present; in view of the difficulty of securing so large an attendance at a general meeting it is suggested that the arrangement be a voluntary one.
