BOOK ON STEELE'S SCOUTS Mr. Wayne F. Brown is in the process of conducting research for a book entitled, *Steele's Scouts of 1885*, which should reach print in a year or so. Part of the information the author is trying to gather pertains to one of the prominent members of that group who was wounded at Loon Lake (Makwa) Narrows, namely J.R. (Henry) Fury. The author is also trying to locate a copy of the photograph which appeared with the short biography published on p. 45 of the July 1973 edition of the *RCMP Quarterly*.

Mr. Brown would like to eventually acquire a complete roster of those who served as scouts with Sam Steele. ST. ROCH PRESERVATION FUND The *St. Roch* was launched in Vancouver in 1928, to serve as a floating RCMP Detachment in Canada's Arctic. Her service to Canada is legendary and in 1954, upon her arrival in Vancouver, the vessel was decommissioned and sold to the city for \$5,000. In 1958, she was placed in drydock at Vanier Park, as part of a British Columbia Centennial project. The second part of this project was to build the Vancouver Maritime Museum adjacent to her.

In 1962, the *St. Roch* was declared a National Historic Site and in 1995, owing

to federal government cutbacks, Parks Canada transferred responsibility for the vessel to the City of Vancouver, which then transferred operations to the Vancouver Maritime Museum.

The Vancouver Maritime Museum established the *St. Roch* Preservation Fund to ensure that future generations can enjoy the ship and her history. All proceeds from the sale of *St. Roch* items benefit the Fund. The items include:

- a) *St. Roch* replicas, individually crafted and five inches long, in pewter, silver or gold plate, with or without a dustcover, at prices ranging from \$45 to \$160;
- b) a beautiful limited-edition poster of the *St. Roch* by maritime Artist Robert McVittie for \$10, and
- c) a *St. Roch* model kit for \$119.95.
