He was promoted to corporal May 1, 1948; sergeant May 1, 1952; staff sergeant Nov. 1, 1955.

WAZNEY Reg. No. 22818, ex-S/Sgt. William Stanley Wazney, 56, died April 5, 1999, at Coquitlam, B.C. He was born May 8, 1942, at St. Boniface, Man., and joined the Force Aug. 17, 1962, at Winnipeg. Upon completion of training at "Depot," Wazney was posted to "E" Division, B.C., at Port Coquitlam, Chilliwack, Burnaby, Victoria, Vancouver and Pitt Meadows, retiring Aug. 12, 1998. He was promoted to corporal Oct. 1, 1971; sergeant Oct. 1, 1976; staff sergeant June 10, 1981. WIGHT Reg. No. 12111, ex-S/S/M Stanley Stewart Wight, 84, died Jan. 27, 1999, at Regina. He was born Oct. 14, 1914, at Brooks, Alta., and joined the Force as a trumpeter Feb. 16, 1934, at Calgary. Upon completion of training at "Depot," Wight was posted there and on Oct. 1, 1934, he became a constable. On Jan. 1, 1935, he was transferred to "F" Division, at Regina, taking his discharge Feb. 15, 1940. Wight reengaged into the Force July 22, 1940, at Calgary, and was posted to "H" Division, N.S., at Glace Bay and New Waterford. He was subsequently transferred to the following locations: Apr. 1, 1932, to "H" Division, N.S., at Halifax; July 1, 1946, to "K" Division, Alta., at Edmonton, retiring Jan. 1, 1952. Wruburton was promoted to lance corporal Nov. 1, 1935; corporal May 1, 1938; sergeant Nov. 1, 1941; staff sergeant May 1, 1949.
