

SCHEDULE

Of certain Lands vested in the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, by this Act.

1st. The three Reserves in the Township of Sherbrooke, in the County of Haldimand, at or near the *embouchure* of the Grand River, on the north shore of Lake Erie, containing two hundred and sixty acres, more or less, to wit: The first at the mouth of Grand River, containing 219 acres, more or less; the second at Barbet Point or *Pointe au Barbet*, containing 48 acres, 2 roods, and 32 perches more or less; and the third at Mohawk Bay, containing 20 acres more or less.

2nd. Those Reserves situate in the Townships of Tiny and Tay, in the County of Simcoe, on the south easterly side of Penetanguishene Harbor, containing three hundred and eighty nine acres, more or less.

3rd. Those Reserves situate near the City of Kingston, to wit: Point Frederick and the Inlets designated as Haldimand Cove and Hamilton Cove.

4th. Those Reserves, situate on the east branch of the Holland River, in the town plot of Gwillimbury, in the County of to wit: Lots numbers 49, 50, 51, and 52, west side of Meadow street, containing together about 4 acres.

5th. Those Reserves at Pointe Pelée, in the Township of Mersea, in the County of Essex, containing 3000 acres, more or less.

6th. Lot number 13 in the eleventh concession of the Township of Vespra, in the County of Simcoe, containing 200 acres, more or less.

7th. Lots number 1, in the first and second concession of the Island of St. Joseph, in Lake Huron, with the broken fronts to the south of the said lots, containing 500 acres, more or less.

8th. The south half of lot number 6, in the ninth concession of the said Island of St. Joseph, on Milford Haven, containing 106 acres, more or less.

9th. All the land conveyed by a certain deed from Captain R. O'Connor, acting by his Attorney J. B. Marks, to R. Barrie, bearing date 23rd August, 1819, and witnessed by Wm. Joseph Robins and James Nichols, Junior.
