So much of 26 Geo. III, Cap. 26, for encouraging the Newfoundto Bounties, continued till Jan. 1, 1803.

THEREAS the Laws herein-after mentioned have, by Experience, been found useful and beneficial, and it is expedient that the same should be further continued; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That so much of an Act made in the Twenty-sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled, An Act to amend and render more effectual the several Laws now in Force for encouraging the Fisheries carried on the Newfound-land Fisheries, at Newfoundland and Parts adjacent, from Great Britain, Ireland, and etc. as relates the British Dominions in Europe; and for granting Bounties for a limited Time, on certain Terms and Conditions, as relates to the Bounties thereby granted, which was to continue in Force for the Term of Ten Years, from the First Day of January One thousand seven hundred and eightyfeven; and which was revived and further continued by Three Acts made in the Thirty-seventh, Thirty-ninth, and Thirty-ninth and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and two, shall be, and the same is hereby further continued until the First Day of January One thousand eight hundred and three.
