For the question this week the Gateway asked the students: Did you watch *Amerika*? Why or why not? Should the protestors get equal time?

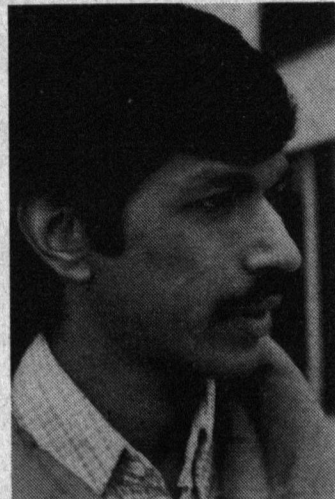

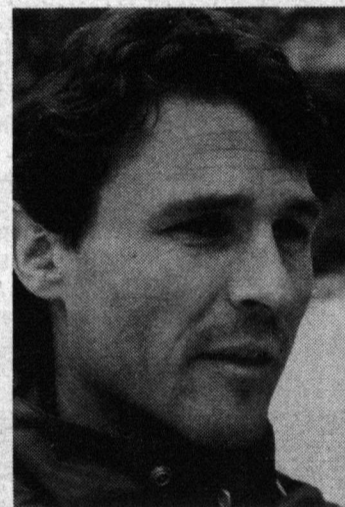
"I didn't watch it on grounds of principle. It was anti-Russia and I didn't agree with its stance. I signed the petition going around for equal time."

### Student Ombudsman Service

G.F.C. 52.4.1 (b) The instructor should mark and return to students **with reasonable dispatch** all term examinations and, provided the students submit them by the due date, all course projects, papers, essays, etc.

All projects, papers, essays, etc., should be returned **on or by the last day of classes** in the course, with the exception of a final major project or paper (which may be due on the last day of classes), which should be returned by the date of the scheduled final examination or, in non-examination courses, by the last day of the examination period.
